
When we travel to work, study or accessing services, we need to be safe. Take the pledge, make every journey safer!

### 12 May, from Traffic and Highway Patrol Command - NSW Police Force



Six police motorcycles are set to be deployed onto the M1 Motorway as part of an ongoing high-visibility operation over the next couple of months.

NSW Police will launch Operation Hondo from Sunday (14 May 2023) and will continue throughout May and June, focusing on reducing road fatalities and trauma.


Operation Hondo will specifically target the major factors contributing to road trauma – including speed, mobile phone use, drink and drug driving, and dangerous driving behaviours such as tailgating, unsafe lane changing, and vehicles not keeping to the left.

While the police motorcycles will predominantly patrol the M1 Motorway between Beresford and Wahroonga, they will be continuing the enforcement operation on local roads and nearby suburbs.

Officers will also continue regular daily taskings, to ensure the safety of all motorists not just on the M1 but all surrounding roads.



### 16 May, from Sutherland Shire Command: WHO HAS TO GIVE WAY?



When you're driving on a road and the number of lanes or lines of traffic reduces, and there are no longer any road markings, you must give way to the vehicle that's ahead of you. This is called a zipper merge.

Answer: When two lanes reduce to one lane, the car trailing behind (Car B) must give way to the car ahead (Car A)

From today, you'll need a pathology referral form to get a free PCR test for COVID-19





For most people, if you have COVID-19 symptoms, please do a rapid antigen test (RAT). RATs are available for free at Service NSW service centres, mobile service centres and recovery centres.

Some people are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 which means they are more likely to get very sick and may need hospital care.

If you are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19, contact your doctor for testing advice.

If you can't contact your doctor, call healthdirect on 1800 022 222 or use healthdirect's online Service Finder to find a GP near you.

If your doctor recommends a COVID-19 PCR test, they will give you a pathology referral form for a free COVID-19 PCR test.


The referral form will have a private pathology provider location to visit so you can get tested.

### 15 May, from North Shore Times

NSW Police has released this statement after a man died in hospital following a fall at a north shore unit yesterday.

About 11pm on Friday (12 May 2023) officers from North Shore Police Area Command attended a unit on Shirley Street, Wollstonecraft, after reports of a

domestic incident.

Police spoke to the occupants, a 41-year-old woman and a 41-year-old man.

As part of inquiries, the man was arrested and taken to Chatswood Police Station before being released pending further investigation.

Just after 6am yesterday (Saturday 13 May 2023), police were called to the same unit after reports a man was attempting to gain entry to the property.

Officers from North Shore Police Area Command attended and after entering the unit, saw a man lying injured on the driveway below.

Officers immediately rendered first aid to the man until the arrival of NSW Ambulance paramedics. He was treated and taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a critical condition.

A critical incident was declared, and investigators were later notified the 41year-old man had died in hospital just after 11pm last night.

The critical incident team comprised of officers from Kuring Gai Police Area Command will now investigate the circumstances surrounding the incident. That investigation will be subject to independent review.

All information will be provided to the Coroner who will determine the cause of death and make any findings about the events leading to the man's death.

No further details are available at this time.

### 13 May, from NSW Health: COVID-19 weekly update - Friday 12 May 2023



In the 7 days to 4pm Thursday 11 May:

- 12,980 new cases of COVID-19 have been recorded: 6,366 rapid antigen tests (RATs) and 6,614 PCR tests
- 59 lives lost

As at 4pm Thursday 11 May:

- 1,292 people with COVID-19 in hospital
- 31 people with COVID-19 in ICU

The items most commonly stolen from vehicles include:





Wallets (including bank cards and licences)

Electronic devices including mobile phones, tablets and other small items. Generally, a vehicle is a target because the items stolen are visible from the outside. Unlocked doors also make it easy for curious criminals to enter your vehicle without creating much noise or commotion.

Make sure you remove all valuables from your vehicle and always lock your doors!

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Retirement Communities':

**Tip #2.** . Don't rely on flyscreens as security doors.

**Tip #6.** Engrave all valuable items with an identifying number. An engraver is available for loan from your crime prevention officer. For delicate items such as phones, use an UltraViolet marker pen.

**Tip #9.** Please always feel you can ask for help! You have probably helped others all your life—it's your turn to be offered assistance, to be comfortable, happy and safe.

**Tip #11.** Use ATMS inside the bank. Take your time. If you are worried about someone nearby, cancel the transaction. Hide that cash! Don't advertise the fact that you have money. Did you know some supermarkets will let you take out \$50 with no purchase necessary?
