22 May, from Ku-ring-gai command: Scammers impersonate Chinese government authorities or military officials and extort the victim.

They tell the victim they have been implicated in a crime and need to pay money to avoid deportation. As the scam escalates, through coercion, they get victims to stage their OWN fake kidnapping. The families involved are led to believe the victim is in danger and a ransom needs to be paid to secure their release.

HOW TO REPORT:

- 1. In an EMERGENCY call 000.
- 2. Call the Police Assistance Line (PAL) 131 444 (for all non-emergency reporting)
- DO NOT send any money and hang up the call immediately.
- DO NOT reveal any PERSONAL information.
- DO collect as much information/data about the scammer as possible.
- DO report any suspicious scam/behaviour to Police & ScamWatch.
- DO speak to friends/family about the incident for support.
- DO contact the Chinese Consulate for advice and to report

The alleged driver - an 18-year-old man -is due to appear at Manly Local Court today (Friday 19 May 2023).


19 May, from NSW Police: Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a man missing from Sydney's Northern Beaches.

Himanshu Khurana, aged 30, was last seen at a home on Pittwater Road, North Manly, last month (April 2023). When he could not be located, he was reported missing to officers attached to Northern Beaches Police Area Command last week. Police have commenced inquiries into his whereabouts.

Himanshu is described as being of Indian Sub-continental appearance, about 170cm tall, of medium build with short black hair and is unshaven.

23 May, from the Australian Federal Police: Sydney man jailed for importing gun parts
This is a joint release with the Australian Federal Police and Australian Border Force.

A man, 47, from Sydney's outer northern suburbs has been sentenced to nearly seven years' jail for unlawfully importing firearms parts and possessing ammunition and unregistered firearms. The **Berowra** man pleaded guilty to importing the gun components in three packages sent from the US in 2019 that were labelled as car parts. The packages, which were identified by the Australian Border Force (ABF) at the Sydney Gateway Facility in 2019, contained two barrels and a frame for a Sig Sauer handgun, upper and lower receivers for an AR-15 semi-automatic rifle and triggers for a firearm. The detection was referred to the AFP and the joint investigation was launched.

Last month (28 April, 2023), the man faced Sydney District Court where he pleaded guilty to the following offences:

- Two counts of intentionally importing tier 2 goods without approval, contrary to section 233BAB(5) of the *Customs Act 1901* (Cth);
- One count of possessing more than three unregistered firearms, contrary to section 51D(2) of the Firearms Act 1996 (Cth);
- Four counts of possessing a prohibited weapon, contrary to section 7(1) of the *Weapons Prohibition Act 1998* (NSW);

- One count of acquiring a firearm part, contrary to section 50AA(1) of the Firearms Act 1996 (NSW); and
- Six counts of acquiring a firearm part, contrary to section 50AA(2) of the *Firearms Act* 1996 (NSW).

He was sentenced to two years and nine months' imprisonment with a non-parole period of one year and five months for the Commonwealth offences, and four years' imprisonment with a non-parole period of two years for the state offences.

22 May, from Sydney Wildlife: On Monday 15th May, Sydney Wildlife Rescue received an email from a member of the public concerned about an Australian brush turkey that had been spotted with a dart in its back in Wahroonga Park, located on Coonanbarra Road in Wahroonga.

Immediately one of our volunteers searched the area high and low for the turkey with no luck, and we have since been monitoring the site on a regular basis. The injured turkey has also been seen around 25-29 Millewa Ave, Wahroonga.

Any intentional harm to wildlife is a criminal act and is always reported to the relevant authorities. We will continue to monitor and search for the brush turkey until it is caught and the dart removed. If you are in the area and see this particular bird or any other animal with a similar injury please call our rescue line 9413 4300 immediately so we can send trained volunteers out to contain the bird and remove the dart which will be given to police once retrieved.

19 May, from 9News.com.au: Murder charge for woman after baby dies in hospital

Police are still working on their case against a woman accused of murdering her 10-monthold son. She was not required to appear in court on Thursday and remains in custody but cannot be named to avoid identifying her child, who is allegedly a victim of crime. Police allege she tried to drown the boy at a home in Sydney's north-west before allegedly restricting his breathing at a different home two days later.

18 May, from Redd.it: New things to beware on the internet

On May 3rd, Google released 8 new top-level domains (TLDs) - these are new values like .com, .org, .biz, domain names. These new TLDs were made available for public registration via any domain registrar on 10th May. Usually this would be a cool info, move on with your life and largely ignore it moment. Except a couple of these new domain names are common file type extensions: ".zip" and ".mov".

This means typing out a file name could resolve into a link that takes you to one of these new URLs, whether it's in an email, on your tumblr blog post, a tweet, or in file explorer on your desktop. What was previously plain text could now resolve as link and go to a malicious website where people are expecting to go to a file and therefore download malware without realising it.

16 May, from Hornsby Council: Public Exhibition of the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Bush Fire Management Committee draft Bush Fire Risk Management Plan

A Bush Fire Risk Management Plan (BFRMP) is a comprehensive document that maps and describes the level of bush fire risk across an area and the proposed treatments to minimise and mitigate the risk.

A BFRMP identifies bush fire issues, identifies assets at risk, assesses the level of risk, and establishes treatment strategies to minimise the risk and who is responsible for carrying out the treatments identified. These treatment strategies may directly affect you and your property.

The Hornsby Ku-ring-gai BFRMP, has recently been reviewed. Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Bush Fire Management Committee (BFMC) invites you to view the draft BFRMP and make comments by 30 June 2023.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Safer Drivers':

- Tip #1. Never cause an accident just because you think you are right!
- **Tip #5.** Leave space between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you, sufficient to stop safely. Use the '3 second rule' see when the car ahead passes a landmark and start counting: "One Mississippi, two Mississippi, three Mississippi" (each one takes a second to say). If you can't count to three in the time it takes for you to reach the same landmark, then there is insufficient space for you to do an emergency stop.
- **Tip #11.** We all enter a roundabout as equals no approach road has priority. Give way to those already on roundabouts, including those entering before you from your left. Roundabouts are designed to keep the traffic flowing.
- **Tip #16.** No part of your body should be outside the vehicle. Don't let your passenger put their feet on the dash the airbags will smash their knees into their face.
