12 June, from NSW Police:

The lights of Vivid Sydney will be switched off for one minute at 7.30pm tonight (Monday 12 June 2023), in honour of the victims involved in the fatal bus crash at Greta.

This will include the Sydney Opera House, Sydney Harbour Bridge, Museum of Contemporary Art and the skyscrapers along Circular Quay.

Ticketed events such as 'Lightscape', 'Dark Spectrum' and 'Wild Lights' will proceed as scheduled.



12 June, from NSW Police: A man will face court tomorrow charged over a fatal bus crash in the state's Hunter region.

Just after 11.30pm yesterday (Sunday 11 June 2023), emergency services were called to the roundabout on Wine Country Drive near the Hunter Expressway off ramp at Greta, after reports a coach had rolled.

A large-scale emergency response commenced involving officers from <u>Hunter Valley Police District</u>, <u>Rescue & Bomb Disposal</u>, <u>Traffic and Highway Patrol Command</u>, <u>NSW Ambulance</u> paramedics, <u>Fire and Rescue NSW</u>, <u>NSW Rural Fire Service</u>, and various helicopters for hospital transports.

The driver of the bus – a 58-year-old man – was taken to hospital under police guard for mandatory testing and assessment.

He was later transferred to Cessnock Police Station where he was charged with ten counts of dangerous driving occasioning death - drive manner dangerous, and negligent driving (occasioning death).

Investigations into the circumstances surrounding the crash are ongoing.

11 June, from NSW Police: Do you recognise these males?

Police have released CCTV as they appeal for public information after infrastructure was allegedly damaged in Darling Harbour overnight.

Detectives have been told about 3.15am today (Sunday 11 June 2023), three unknown males were walking along Tumbalong Boulevard in Darling Harbour where they allegedly damaged lighting infrastructure to the value of approximately \$280,000.

Corben LYNN aged 29, is wanted by virtue of outstanding arrest warrants in relation to Malicious Damage offences).


He is described as being Caucasian, 190cm tall, thin build, fair complexion with brown hair

This morning I watched a white Hyundai i30 get hit in rear right corner while parked in the car park behind Stanley street shops. If the owner needs a witness or photos I've got both.



- Tip #13. Report all criminal activity to police. Phone Police Assistance
 Line (PAL) 131 444, or 000 (Triple Zero) for an urgent Police response.
- Tip #15. All computer access to be monitored & passwords changed regularly.
- Tip #16. Shred or dispose of any confidential documents or personal information.
- Tip #20. Any suspicious/unauthorised persons found on premises to be challenged. Call 000 (Triple Zero) if deemed necessary. Report everything that doesn't appear to be right.
 Trust your instincts.
