16 July, from NSW Police Force

Police are re-appealing for public assistance to locate 22-year-old Melissa Borg. She was last seen leaving a hospital in Westmead, around 11am on Wednesday 24 May 2023.

Melissa is described as being of Caucasian appearance, about 170cm tall, medium build, brown eyes and brown hair.

Melissa is known to frequent the Lalor Park, Seven Hills, Blacktown, Kings Langley, and Kings Park areas.

16 July, from NSW Police Force

Seven people have been charged after more than \$7 million worth of prohibited drugs were seized from homes across Sydney's south and south-west.

In September 2022, officers from Bankstown Region Enforcement Squad (RES) established Strike Force Nemarang to investigate the supply of prohibited drugs across Sydney's metro regions.

Following inquiries, strike force investigators executed search warrants at homes in Parramatta, Fairfield West, and Leppington on Thursday 29 June 2023.

During the search warrants, investigators located 6.4kg of methamphetamine, 4.1kg of heroin, 1.5kg of cocaine, 866g of MDMA, more than \$200,000 in cash, \$18,000 in foreign currency, electronic devices, and an emergency siren.

13 July, from NSW Police: Can you help us find Emmanuelle?



A Geo-targeting alert has been issued for Emmanuelle Dayes to the Hornsby area. If you receive a message from +6144444444, it is not a scam.

Have you seen Emmanuelle?

Emmanuelle Dayes, aged 50, last seen at a residence on Jack Russel Road, Berrilee, on Saturday (8 July 2023).

She was last contacted about 10.45am Sunday (9 July 2023).

When she could not be contacted officers attached to Kuring Gai Police Area Command were notified today (Thursday 13 July 2023) and commenced inquiries into her whereabouts.

Police and family hold concerns for her welfare as this is out of character. She is described as being of Caucasian appearance, 170cm tall, with a thin build, brown eyes and short grey hair.

Emmanuelle is known to frequent the Berrilee, Maraylya, Dural and Hornsby areas.

She is also known to frequent bushland near Mccallums Road, Berrilee. Anyone with information of her whereabouts is urged to contact Kuring Gai police or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

NSW Road Rules say: The load must not project more than 1.2 metres in front of the vehicle's headlights. The load must be securely attached to the ladder rack and other supporting devices fitted to the vehicle (e.g. roof bars). The load must be arranged so it does not prevent the driver from safely driving or controlling the vehicle.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Car Owners:

- **Tip #1.** When you leave your car unattended (even short periods), close all windows, remove key from ignition and lock all doors. Remember, it's an offence under the Aussie Road Rules to leave your car unlocked.
- Tip #3. Ensure you have removed all valuable property from view [e.g. mobile phone, sunglasses, bag, wallet, loose change, clothing, laptop, iPod]. Either take them with you, or lock them in the boot. Remove all signs that property may be in the car, e.g. no blankets covering tempting lumps on the back seat, no carrier bags.
- Tip #6. Park in well-lit, high pedestrian areas, preferably with CCTV.
 Avoid car parks with a history of break-ins
- Tip #10. Don't leave personal papers, such as licence or registration, in your vehicle. They may be used to dispose of the vehicle. However, do keep with you a note of your vehicle registration and Vehicle Information Number (VIN).
