08 August, from Eastern Suburbs command: Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a man wanted by virtue of arrest warrants.

Anthony Christopher RYDER, age 47, is wanted for three outstanding arrest warrants. Police have received information that RYDER could be attending the Eastern Suburbs area. RYDER is described as being of Caucasian appearance, with a thin build, red/ginger coloured hair and green eyes. Anyone who sees him or knows of his whereabouts should not approach him but contact police via **Triple Zero (000) or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000**.



08 August, from NSW Police: Eastern Beaches Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a teenaged girl missing from the Eastern Suburbs area.

Luisa Va'aparamu, aged 13, was last seen leaving her home in Chifley yesterday morning (Monday 7 August 2023). When she failed to return home from school she was reported missing to Eastern Beaches Police Area Command about 7pm. Police have commenced inquiries into her whereabouts as they and her family hold concerns for her welfare due to her age. Luisa is described as being of Pacific Islander/Maori appearance, 150cm tall, with a slim build, tanned complexion, long black hair dyed brown underneath and dark brown eyes. When she was last seen she was wearing her school uniform which consists of a white shirt and dark blue skirt.

She is known to frequent the East Gardens shopping precinct, Maroubra and Macquarie Fields area.

Anyone with information on her whereabouts is urged to contact **Maroubra Police or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.**



05 August, from NSW Police: Have you seen Robbie or Simon?

Police are appealing for public assistance to locate Robbie O'Reilly, aged 34, and Simon Khurana, aged 36, both wanted by virtue of outstanding arrest warrants for robbery in company, participate in criminal group and other serious offences. Detectives from the State Crime Command's Robbery and Serious Crime Squad have been conducting inquiries into their whereabouts. Robbie - described as being of Caucasian appearance, with short dark hair and a beard, blue eyes and wears glasses - was previously residing on the Central Coast but is now believed to be staying in the Port Stephens area and frequenting Raymond Terrace. Simon - described as being of Caucasian appearance with an olive complexion, about 170cm to 180 cm tall, of medium build, with brown eyes. He is believed to be frequenting the Central Coast area. Anyone who sees Robbie or Simon or may know of their whereabouts is urged not to approach them and contact **Triple Zero (000)** or to contact **Crime Stoppers: 1800 333 000** or <https://nsw.crimestoppers.com.au>. 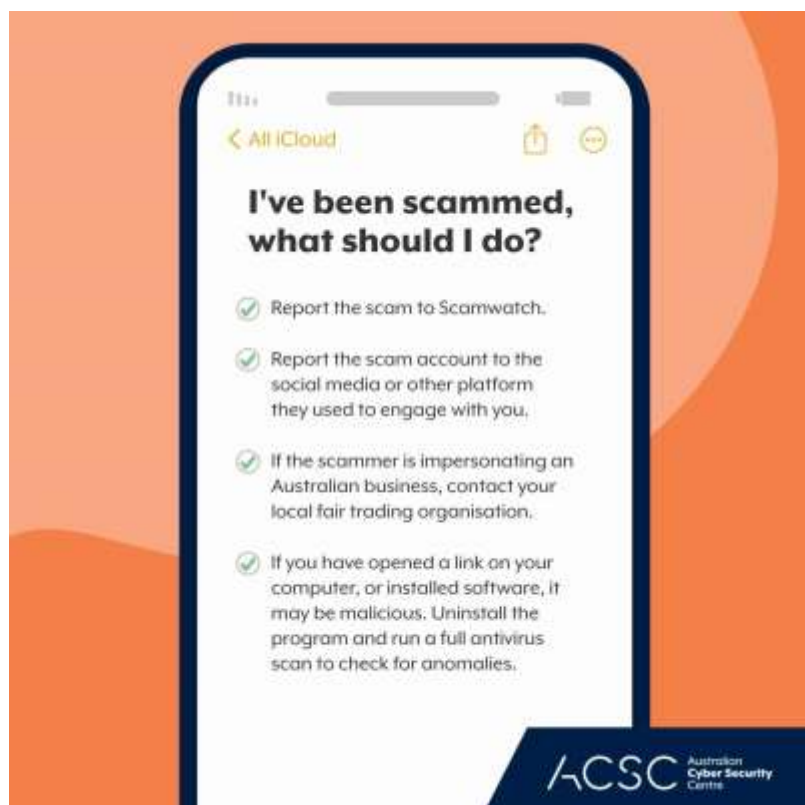
I witnessed a bus hit it this afternoon (Monday). I tried door knocking a few houses close by, but no one answered.

07 August, from Neighbourhood Watch Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: Thank you to Clare, who emailed us last week, following reading the eNewsletter for Tuesday 25 July 2023

I was most interested in the report on local fires in NSW as in Tip #2 which states; '70% of NSW fires are deliberately lit!' I am really concerned about this but have never seen statistics like this posted for our Shire. Can you please provide me with the statistics to report this claim? If proved valid by your references, I think this needs to be amplified to counteract the usual 'global warming 'consequence issues that I believe to be unfounded! Cheers and thanks.

P. S. We have had numerous fires mysteriously started in Mount Colah, Mount Ku-ring gai, Berowra etc and yet we can never find out the causes over the last 10 years and assumed by locals like me to be juveniles/cigarettes flung out of cars etc!

We replied [edited]:

Thanks for emailing us. The 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips concerning Fire Issues' was compiled by volunteers in 2014 using the available stats then. Please read the Fire Prevention Strategy: fire.nsw.gov.au/gallery/files/pdf/community/fire_prevention_toolkit.pdf This was the document utilised at the time, but it doesn't seem to have a date on it. It was produced by the NSW Police, NSW Fire Brigades and the Rural Fire Service. I have attached it as a pdf (fire prevention toolkit.pdf). On page 16 is the direct quote that was taken: "FACT Bush fire Arson Up to 70% of bush and grass fires in NSW are considered to be deliberately lit. Deliberately lit bushfires cost the Community money, have the potential to destroy property; injure and even kill people."

HOW CAN I HELP?

- Note the description of people entering or leaving the fire scene prior to the fire.
- Record the description of vehicles entering or leaving the fire scene prior to the fire.
- Note any activity in the area prior to the fire e.g. camping, firewood collecting, bushwalkers etc.
- Remember the time and location where you first observed the fire.

Pass this information onto the Police or Fire Services or anonymously to CRIMESTOPPERS via 1 800 333 000.

4. What are we hoping to achieve?

 - * Pedestrian crossing in front of Killara High in East Killara is un-monitored, students dribbling across in small numbers, causing traffic jam. Gay & Wal met with the Principal. Julia, Gay & Wal have brainstormed/written a letter with suggestions, which was circulated. Attendees approved the content. Wal to send to Principal, Ku-ring-gai Council & our MP, with cc to Police & NHW, and forwarded to RFS Killara.

04 August, from Turramurra Neighbourhood Watch: A resident came to us for help.

They asked us to share:

Hello. I have had a suspicious person at my property. His picture is attached and his vehicle. Does anyone recognise him? He accesses my property by going around our fence and was concealing something in his pants. Our property has cameras everywhere.





03 August, from Sutherland Shire command:



Answer: Car A has to give way:

When the lane you're driving in is ending and you need to cross a broken line to move into another lane, you must give way to vehicles already in that lane – for example, when you're joining a motorway. Slow down and look for a suitable gap so you can change lanes safely.

03 August, from NSW Road Safety: What should a motorcycle pillion passenger do when stopped at traffic lights?

- A. Place the same foot on the ground as the rider.
- B. Place both feet on the ground.
- C. Keep both feet on the footpegs.



Answer: Thanks for all your responses! The answer is C.

The rider is in control of the motorcycle when it stops. The pillion passenger's feet should remain on the footpegs.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Homes:

- **Tip #7.** The power board should be housed in a secured cabinet. Consider an ETSA padlock on the meter cupboard (a special lock available from locksmiths).
- **Tip #8.** Lock all garages, sheds and under-house access points. Lock away all tools

and ladders to prevent them being used to gain access to your home. Roller, tilt & panel-lift doors can be secured with additional hasp & staple lock sets and/or padlocks. Anchor all sheds, sculptures, outside ornaments & table & chair sets.

- **Tip #12.** External doors should be solid and fitted with deadlocks. Install patio bolts on sliding doors. Consider security doors.
- **Tip #19.** Suggest an arrangement with neighbours for when any of you are on vacation, eg for regularly checking your home, clearing the local newspapers, putting out & retrieving garbage bins, clearing mailboxes, parking in driveways/spaces, mowing grass strips, etc. Consider placing old items on the washing line. NEVER advertise your travel plans on social media. Consider redirecting/holding your mail.
- **Tip #20.** Consider promoting a dog on site: a dog water dish, dog lead and warning signs. Consider connecting the sensor lighting to a socket unit that can 'bark' (or 'chirrup') as a warning/deterrent.
