

17 August, from NSW Police: SCAM ALERT S

Scammers impersonating the Australian Taxation Office are attempting to steal your myGov username & password. These scams encourage you to click on a link that directs you to fake myGov log on pages. The ATO doesn't send text messages or emails containing login links for online services. Keep safe - access your account by typing http://ato.gov.au or http://my.gov.au into your internet browser. 17 August, from NSW Police: Have you seen Susan?

Police are issuing a renewed appeal for public assistance to locate a woman missing from the Woy Woy area following new information about her possible whereabouts. Susan Chiddy, aged 62, was last seen leaving a home on The Boulevard, Woy Woy about 10am Friday 4 August 2023. Unable to be located since, Susan was reported missing to officers attached to Brisbane Water Police District, who commenced inquiries into her whereabouts. Police and family hold concerns for her welfare. She is described as being of Caucasian appearance, 170-175cm tall, with a thin build, and grey bob style hair. She was last seen wearing grey track pants, a beige jumper, white socks and white slides with blue stripes.

Following extensive inquires police believe she was seen on Reeve Street, Somersby, yesterday morning (Wednesday 16 August 2023). Susan is known to frequent the Woy Woy, Blackwall, Empire Bay, Killcare, West Gosford and Narara areas.

colouring-in and more.


All the community is welcome! Bring a plate.

MAKING A U-TURN

When making a U-turn a driver must: 🚔 have a clear view of any approaching traffic

- he able to make the turn without unreasonably obstructing the free movement of traffic
- pive way to all vehicles and pedestrians.

Drivers are not allowed to make a U-turn:

- at an intersection without traffic lights, where a 'no U-turn' sign is displayed
- at a break in a driving strip where a 'no U-turn' sign is displayed
- across any of the following:
- a single continuous dividing line
- a single continuous dividing line to the left of a broken line
- two parallel continuous dividing lines.

14 August, from Jessica Fletcher to Australia: Missing Presons & Unsolved Crimes: Update on the search for our beloved Emmanuelle Dayes.

After quite a bit of soul searching and careful consideration of all evidence provided by the police, the Dayes family have come to believe that our beloved Emmanuelle Dayes has unsuspiciously walked alone on the 9th of July - carrying no supplies nor tools - deep into the very rugged, treacherous and vast bushland behind her home in Berilee NSW and not made it out. The facts remain that she is missing and police continue to search this bushland with their technology and also chase any other leads provided. But too many variables ranging from CTV footage through to Emmanuelle's actions prior to this event along with numerous other patterns of considered evidence point to this scenario taking place. This is a shocking and devastating blow to all of us. Anyone who knows Emmanuelle knows that she was deeply loved and cherished by her family and friends - far and wide.

- Tip #1. IDENTIFY YOUR 6 IMMEDIATE NEIGHBOURS 2 TO YOUR LEFT, 2 TO
 YOUR RIGHT, ACROSS FROM AND BEHIND YOU. Make an effort to get to know
 them and swap contact details.
- **Tip #4.** INTRODUCE YOURSELF TO YOUR LOCAL POLICE STATION. Where should you park? What information is available there? When is it manned?
- Tip #6. STORE YOUR NEW EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBERS IN LANDLINE & MOBILE PHONES. Include Hornsby Police Station: 9476 9799, Gordon Police Station: 9418 5399 and those overleaf at the bottom.
- Tip #9. CONSIDER HAVING THE LOCKS CHANGED/UPDATED/RE-KEYED. RE-PROGRAMME NEW ALARM CODES FOR THE BURGLAR ALARM.
- Tip #10. HAVE THE BURGLAR ALARM SYSTEM CHECKED. CLEAN THE SENSORS. CHECK BATTERIES. CONSIDER NEW ATTACHMENTS—there are some amazing new technologies available! Eg balcony sensors, broken window sensors. Spray insect products around sensors to prevent spider webs.
