
## 31 August, from Ku-ring-gai command: SEXTORTION reposted from Hawkesbury Police Area Command

There has been an increase in reports to Windsor Police over the past week in relation to sextortion. The social media platform 'Snapchat' has been used by offenders to persuade the victim into sending sexualised or explicit images. Once the images are received the offender threatens to share the content with others unless their demands for money or further images are met.

Please be cautious when interacting online and do not share any personal information with people you DO NOT KNOW. Parents be vigilant in your children's online behaviour and have open discussions about sextortion and the consequences.

confidence. The public is reminded not to report information via NSW Police social media




30 August, from Ku-ring-gai command: P The search for missing man Adam Coulson will recommence tomorrow morning (Wednesday 30 August 2023).

Traffic contraflows will be in place in Galston Gorge during this time.

Road closures of Galston Gorge will be occurring from 9am to allow safe movement of search crews.

04 September from Ryde command: PDON'T BLIND OTHER DRIVERS BY
CONFUSING DAYTIME RUNNING LIGHTS WITH YOUR HEADLIGHTS AT NIGHT!!!

Driving at night with daytime running lights (DRLs) can be an offence. DRLs do not direct light down (light low beams) and do not have the same distance that headlights have.

### 

Daytime Running Lights (DRLs) are lighting devices on vehicles that are designed to increase visibility and improve safety during daylight hours. They are typically located at the front of

the vehicle and are automatically activated whenever the engine is running and the headlights are not turned on.

The purpose of DRLs is to enhance the visibility of vehicles on the road, especially in conditions where the contrast between the vehicle and the surrounding environment is reduced, such as during dawn, dusk, or in poor weather conditions. By increasing the visibility of vehicles, DRLs help other drivers and pedestrians to notice and identify vehicles more easily, reducing the risk of accidents.

DRLs are usually bright, low-intensity lights that are distinct from the headlights. They are often positioned in the front bumper, grille, or near the headlights of the vehicle. Some vehicles use dedicated lamps for DRLs, while others may utilize the low-beam headlights at a reduced brightness level.

It's important to note that DRLs are not intended to replace headlights, as they are not as bright and do not provide the same illumination as headlights. When driving in low light conditions or at night, it is still necessary to turn on the headlights for proper visibility.

DRLs have become mandatory or required by law in many countries as a safety feature, and their use has been associated with a reduction in daytime accidents. They serve as a proactive safety measure by increasing the visibility of vehicles and helping to prevent collisions.

The AFP has today released new images under the world-class initiative, Stop Child Abuse – Trace an Object, in the hope of solving child sexual abuse cold cases. The four non-confrontational images released at part of National Child Protection Week include a room with a fireplace, a bed frame with a built in radio and two linked images that feature a distinctive brick wall pattern and yellow curtains. AFP investigators are hoping that certain details in the images might serve as clues that could help crack cases and potentially remove vulnerable children from harm....

- Always be aware of your surroundings. If you feel you are in danger go to a place where there are plenty of people, like a shop or service station.
- Salvays keep enough money for a taxi or telephone call
- Have your keys ready before you get to your home or car
- Carry a personal alarm or whistle if you have reason to feel unsafe
- If someone threatens you from a vehicle, run in the opposite direction that the vehicle is facing.
- If attacked, shout as loudly as you can.

I wanted to alert you to some suspicious behaviour at Darnley Oval. We have been informed that two men have been sighted taking photos and staying near children at the oval. Police reports have been made and one of these men is known to police. We ask that you remind your children of stranger danger and to discuss a safety plan for what to do when feeling unsafe, including reporting of any suspicious or concerning behaviour to an adult and Police. If children have a phone, taking a photo if safe to do so can be of help to Police when reporting. I'd like to remind families that our school remains a safe place for children to come to should they need help. Our school is open until the cleaner leaves at night between

6:30pm – 7:00pm. Children are able to come into the office from the playground side, go to OSHC for help, or find our cleaner to assist.

### 01 September, from The Hills command: Land Search Update regarding Missing 52yo man Adam COULSON.

Last night Kuring Gai Police Area Command and Hills Police made the difficult decision to scale down land search operations in the Galston Gorge, Hornsby Rifle Range Area - after extensive searches have been unsuccesful in the target areas. Hills Detectives will continue to conduct further enquiries and review all information recieved from the public since Mr COULSON went missing last Friday. Smaller searching operations will continue from today in the area, however we would like to again publicly acknowlege the volunteer resuce units of NSW SES The Hills Unit and NSW SES Hornsby Unit and the many units of NSW Rural Fire Service as well as our own PolAir - NSW Police Force Aviation Command @NSWPoliceDog and NSW Police Rescue.

# From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Personal Safety:

- **Tip #12.** Don't tell burglars you live alone. Leave an answering machine greeting that says "We can't come to the phone right now... ", even if you live alone. If someone is at the door, call out loudly to your imaginary room-mate that you will answer it, "Don't worry—I'll get it!" Don't list your first name on the apartment directory, or name plate.
- **Tip #15.** If walking, use, or pretend to use, a mobile phone. Consider using an App such as Companion, Follow Me, Circle of 6, SafeZone, MyWitness, Get Home Safe (GHS), Glympse, etc. Download the NSWPF emergency+ app now!
- Tip #18. At an ATM, if you feel uncomfortable, cancel the transaction and leave. Or shout, "What do you mean, 'no money'?!" Do not display cash in public—put it away discreetly and fast. Get \$50 cash from supermarket EFTPOS (without making a purchase).
- Tip #19. When driving, lock doors and windows and do not leave valuables in view, especially on the front passenger seat. Where possible, park rear to the curb, giving you a better view of a situation.
- **Tip #20.** Keep emergency numbers as easy dial/memory on your phone. Keep the phone by the bed, and torch for emergencies. Keep your car keys by the bed be aware they can include a panic alarm. Report anything suspicious.
