16 October, from NSW Police: Hate Crimes - How to Report Hate Crimes - NSW Police Force



12 October, from The Hills command: Hills Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a man wanted on an outstanding warrant in Sydney's North West.






17 October, Shared with permission from the Pymble and West Pymble Community Page group:


Given the recent tragedy on Pennant Hills Road I felt it important to write to warn other drivers after dropping off my daughter to her bus stop this morning. Turning right from Dartford onto Pennant Hills road I had the green and large white truck drove straight through the red along PHR from Normanhurst towards Thornleigh. Then turning right from Stuart Ave onto PHR, again having the green, a car travelling from Thornleigh to Normanhurst ran the red light and had I not stopped she would have kept going and most likely hit me. Now I am fully aware that these drivers may not be on this page, but it's more to share this so you know to stay safe and to share with your learners (one of whom I have!) and young drivers, that they should wait and constantly check people have fully stopped before crossing PHR (or any

other main road). We really do not want another tragedy with one of our loved ones.

*In case anyone asks, the white van was too fast for me to get details and ran the second red light near the petrol station so was gone, and I was driving the opposite direction from the car and couldn't get hers.

Hit and Run 12:31PM 13/10



12 October, from the Australian Federal Police: The AFP is encouraging grandchildren of all ages to help seniors learn their cyber ABCs in a bid to stay safe online.

Some older Australians say they are worried about using technology because they fear they will be scammed. As a community, we need to ensure that older Australians can participate online, and be safe doing so.

To keep it simple, we're urging seniors and all Australians to learn their cyber ABCs:

- Avoid clicking on links sent in unsolicited email or text;
- Block calls on mobile devices from suspected scammers; and,
- Call your financial institution immediately if you identify a suspicious transaction or you believe your bank account has been targeted by cyber criminals.

We encourage seniors to take advantage of the resources offered by the AFP and other government agencies and engage in conversations with trusted family members to help them online.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Staff in Aged Care :


- **Tip #5.** Hold regular staff training in relation to managing difficult/violent residents/patients. Call Security/Police for assistance.
- **Tip #11**. Review the environmental layout of the whole site & make changes where there is concealment or a security risk identified. The Crime Prevention Officer at Hornsby Police station can assist with a free Security Audit. **Phone: 9476 9799**.
- **Tip #12.** Business/personal mailboxes should be cleared daily & secured with appropriate locks. The Crime Prevention Officer at Hornsby Police station can assist. **Phone: 9476 9799**.
- **Tip #19.** For deactivated staff, ensure all computer access is removed, and keys & swipe cards are returned.
