They also impersonate well known recruitment agencies.

28 November, from NSW Police Force: Cybercrime Squad charge teenage boy with alleged sextortion and blackmail offences

Cybercrime Squad detectives have charged a teenage boy with a number of alleged sextortion and blackmail offences under Strike Force Lutwyche. On Wednesday 19 October 2023, officers attached to Ryde Police Area Command and State Crime Command's Cybercrime Squad commenced an investigation into the alleged sextortion and blackmail of a 16-year-old girl.

26 November, from NSW Police Force: Teenager charged following pursuit in Mosman - North Shore PAC

A teenager will face court following a pursuit in Sydney's North Shore area. Just after 5am today (Sunday 26 November 2023), officers attached to North Shore Police Area Command attempted to stop a Toyota Hatchback and a white Mercedes hatchback on the Spit Road at Mosman. When the vehicles failed to stop, a pursuit was initiated before the Toyota crashed into a guard rail near Pearl Bay Avenue, Mosman. The driver of the Toyota – a 14-year-old boy – was arrested before being taken to Royal North Shore Hospital for minor injuries.

25 November, from NSW Police Force: Officer charged - Specialist Command

An off-duty police officer has been charged following an alleged assault.

About 12.50am today (Saturday 25 November 2023), officers from Kings Cross Police Area Command responded to reports of an assault along William Street, Darlinghurst. A 26-year-old male constable attached to a specialist command was arrested at the scene and taken to Kings Cross Police Station. The man was charged with three counts of common assault and one count of common assault (DV). He was granted conditional bail to appear at the Downing Centre Local Court on Wednesday 13 December 2023.

Investigations into the matter are continuing. The officer's employment status is currently under review.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Festive Season:

- **Tip #3.** Please remove parcels from display inside your car. Covering with a blanket may not work.
- **Tip #4.** Before Xmas, don't leave the Xmas presents under the Xmas tree if they can be seen from the windows, or by visitors when you answer the door. After Xmas, remove from view any packaging that came with any new expensive items.
- Tip #13. Do not share anything on Social Media to indicate you are on holiday. If
 possible, avoid setting up auto-replies to emails. [See also 'Our 20 Favourite Crime

- Tip #15. Beware allowing parcels to be delivered to your empty house doorstep.
 Thieves follow delivery vans. Consider requesting a FREE 24/7 parcel locker, or have mail held at the local post office. Maybe ask family or neighbours to help out?
- **Tip #17.** If you are going on a road trip, check your car's safety before you travel. Service your vehicle, tyres and trailer. Check the safety of any load or trailer: www.rms.nsw.gov.au/roads/safety-rules/road-rules/towing.html.

He tends to wander to Darnley oval (directly across from our house) and enjoys to nibble as much rabbit poo as he can until we've noticed he's missing or one of our lovely neighbours has told him to go home, which he will then sit on our porch until I arrive back home (manor seperation anxiety). I was not home from 12:30pm-2pm yesterday Nov 23rd. Upon my return, chopper was sitting on my porch with slashes to his face, legs and arms. He was rushed to the vet for an emergency operation. The vet concluded the wounds are consistent with a sharp, clean man made object (most likely a knife of some sort).
