# 12 January, from Traffic and Highway Patrol Command - NSW Police Force

Officers from The Hills Highway Patrol suspend a 20-year-old male from Glenwood travelling 78 km/hr over the sign posted speed limit.

About 4.35am on Wednesday the 10th of January 2024, officers were conducting stationary speed enforcement along Windsor Road, Castle Hill and detected a blue Mercedes travelling at 138 km/hr in a sign posted 60 km/hr zone. The vehicle was stopped and officers spoke with a male driver who produced an NSW C Class licence. Checks on that licence revealed that his provisional licence was completed only 4 months ago. The driver returned negative results for alcohol and drugs.

The driver was issued an infringement notice for Exceed Speed Limit - over 45 kph, his NSW driver's licence was suspended and confiscated on the spot for a period of 6 months. The vehicle was not owned by the driver and the number plates remained on the vehicle.

# 12 January, from 10 News First Sydney

NSW Police Force have foiled a plot to kill the rappers of Sydney rap group, Onefour resulting in the arrests of two men.

It is alleged the members of the rap group made up of Pio 'YP' Misa, Dahcell "Celly14" Ramos, Spencer "Spenny" Magalogo and Jerome "J Emz" Misa, were targeted in the alleged murder plot.

The alleged plot was uncovered by Strike Force Tromperie, which is run by the State Crime Command's Organised Crime Group and the NSW Crime Commission, finding an associate of the Haouchar crime clan had accepted a contract from another gang to murder the group.

In a series of house raids, officers arrested a 26-year-old man and a 20-year-old man, charging them both with conspiracy to murder, conspiracy to kidnap, conspiracy to commit armed robbery, firearm offences, and large commercial quantity of prohibited drug supply.



# 12 January, from NSW Police Force

Four men have been charged and drugs and cash worth more than \$1.3m seized, after simultaneous search warrants were executed in homes across Sydney yesterday.

Following extensive investigations, detectives from Bankstown Region Enforcement Squad and Wollongong Police District executed seven search warrants simultaneously at homes across Cecil Hills, Sadleir, Punchbowl, Bankstown, and Castle Hill, about 1.30pm yesterday (Wednesday 10 January 2024).

Officers seized a total of 6.5 litres of 1,4-butanediol, 1kg of heroin, 981.7g methylamphetamine, cannabis, MDMA, and cocaine, a mobile phone, and \$270,000 cash. These items will undergo forensic examination. More details here.



## 10 January, from Australian Federal Police

The AFP has joined <u>NSW Police Force</u> to renew the global appeal to locate James Dalamangas as the Greek statute of limitations nears.

James Dalamangas is wanted over the fatal stabbing of Sydney man George Giannopoulous at a nightclub in Belmore on Sunday 25 April 1999, before it's alleged he fled to Greece.

An age-progression image of James Dalamangas has been released, showing what he may look like now, aged 54.

Records indicate Mr Dalamangas is of Middle Eastern/Mediterranean appearance, approximately 182cm tall, with brown hair, brown eyes and a Greek inscription tattoo on his right forearm.

He may be using the names 'James', 'Jim' or 'Tim' with surnames 'Dimitrious' or 'Kanis'.

The game brings to life the latest research from child protection experts through scenarios and games, teaching children (aged 3+) important personal safety skills to help keep them safe.


Each scenario is underpinned by Ditto's 3 Keep Safe Rules:

- ♣Nothing is so yucky that you can't tell someone about it.

# 16 January, from Hawkesbury Police Area Command: ■BEWARE OF QR CODES ■



#### Malicious QR codes can:

- Add an unknown contact to the mobile phone list.
- Connect the victim's device to malicious networks.
- Automatically initiate phone calls, emails and send text messages from your device.
- · Reveal the victim's location.
- Enable the camera on the device and commence recording.
- Download further viruses and malware to the device which may provide full access to the attacker.

How to safeguard yourself:

- Avoid scanning unnecessary QR codes.
- When scanning a QR code, check the link address to ensure it's a legitimate web page. Scam sites often have hyphens, symbols or misspelt words.

- Be aware of malicious QR codes that might be placed over genuine QR codes in restaurants and public places.
- Be cautious of parking tickets with QR codes which may lead you to fraudulent websites.
- Be cautious of QR codes redirecting you to digital crypto exchanges.
- Enable multifactor authentication to prevent theft of login credentials.
- Be careful about granting permissions when an app asks as some permissions could be dangerous.
- Install a mobile security app for virus and malware protection to keep your mobile devices safe and secure.

# 14 January, from 9news.com.au: Man charged over alleged sexual assault of elderly woman, 87, at Sydney aged care facility



An 80-year-old man has been charged after he allegedly sexually assaulted an elderly woman at an aged care facility in <u>Sydney's</u> north-west.

Police were called to the aged care home in Galston yesterday and later arrested the man at a home in nearby Asquith.

Paramedics treated the 87-year-old woman at the scene and she was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital without any serious physical injuries.

Police said the man was "known to visit the facility" and had allegedly entered the woman's room on two occasions before sexually assaulting her.

A crime scene was established at the aged care home. Police arrested the man at the Asquith home at 7.40pm.

He was taken to Hornsby police station and charged with the aggravated sexual assault of a victim with cognitive impairment and aggravated sexual touching. He was also charged with failing to store a firearm properly.

The man was refused bail to appear in court today.

 →Regularly check the waterway for hazards such as people, or other vessels when towing

- ←The skipper, observer and the person being towed must all stay under the 0.05 alcohol limit.



# 12 January, from Ryde Police Area Command

Firearms must be stored in a secure receptacle that is not easily penetrable. If a receptacle's weight is less than 150kg when empty, it must be fixed to prevent it's easy removal.

Ammunition must be stored in a locked receptacle separately within or external to the firearms safe.

## 11 January, from Berowra Rural Fire Brigade

Media release Gully Road Berowra, Fire Track & Bushfire Mitigation Works
10 January 2024 The NSW Rural Fire Service has been working with the
Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council (MLALC) to reduce the vegetation
behind the properties in Gully Road at Berowra.

This has enabled the creation of an Asset Protection Zone (APZ) behind the houses in Gully Road on the Eastern Side and removing vegetation off the Gully Road Track to allow it to be navigated more readily. Removal of the removed vegetation continues to take place.

Resident can see considerable work has taken place, and many have expressed their thanks for making it happen.

The works have been carried under the auspices of the recently approved Hornsby/Kur-ring-gai Bushfire Risk Management Plan (BFRMP) which can be accessed here.

For anyone who needs a refresher, the rule is this: on multi-lane roads with a speed limit of more than 80km/h, you must keep left unless overtaking, turning right, or making a U-turn.

# 11 January, Neighbourhood Watch - Normanhurst

We have been contacted by a resident:

We have seen an increase in graffiti in the Normanhurst area that we have never seen before. Almost every 5 metres, walking from Loreto College down Pennant Hills Road towards Thornleigh you will find someone's ugly graffiti tag. Tags such as "Cosmo" "Doser" "Mosk" "Poker" "Shrek" "Skamar". Normanhurst is starting to look like the ghetto's.

I have reported it but I will make sure to utilise the links you have provided too. I am also writing to our Premier to lobby for a change in firmer legislation and perhaps also a dedicated community day twice a year for cleaning up graffiti. Our response:

We can share the graffiti pictures and warn the community to look out for suspicious behaviour/people. (Neighbourhood Watch isn't a reporting agency.)

Have you reported all the graffiti? There are several ways to report.

The NSW Graffiti hotline records the graffiti and lets public assets know. 1800 707 125 between 7am and 7pm Monday to Friday.

The police are only interested if you are the victim ie it's on your property. You can also inform public assets, eg railways, electricity companies, post boxes, by using the Snap Send Solve <u>App</u>.

Council would appreciate knowing about their properties, but they prefer use of email, rather than Snap Send Solve. Phone Hornsby Council's Graffiti Hotline on 1800 199 282 or visit site <a href="here.">here.</a>

The schools can be emailed (the email is usually on the school website) or the NSW Graffiti Hotline will contact them directly.

Hope that helps and it can be stopped. Thank you for being so community minded.
