25 March, from NSW Police Force

In 2018, Senior Constable Jonathan Wright faced the harrowing reality of road trauma firsthand when he and a fellow officer were struck by a distracted driver. Jonathan's life was saved by blood transfusions after sustaining serious injuries. Today, he tirelessly works to educate communities about road safety.



Traffic and Highway Patrol Command officers see first-hand the very real need for blood when they arrive on the scene of crashes where people have suffered serious injuries and will require donations. That's why they've launched a

weeklong blood drive to help draw attention to the impact of road trauma on communities, ahead of the Easter Long Weekend.

- e) Drop back to a safe three second gap between him and you?






26 March, from Westleigh Rural Fire Brigade: HAZARD REDUCTION NOTIFICATION

What's your approach for checking online reviews?

Whether you're researching accommodation for the holidays or looking for somewhere for brunch on the weekend, many of us like to check the experiences of others.

Unfortunately some of the reviews might be fake. We recommend checking reviews across a range of sources, including independent review platforms.

24 March, from Traffic and Highway Patrol Command - NSW Police ForceSeatbelts help to save lives, except for this one....

Hawkesbury Highway Patrol were recently conducting random stationary testing on Londonderry Road at Richmond when they spoke with a driver about his

seatbelt. Not only was the seatbelt not being worn, an inspection of the seatbelt found it to be dangerously defective. He was issued a defect notice and infringement in the amount of \$387 and three demerit points. Please ensure your seatbelts don't look like this.

Scam warning

Scammers are posing as sellers of secondhand cars and caravans on social media. They pressure buyers into paying a deposit to "secure" the item. After the deposit is transferred, the scammer disappears.

Don't rush into deals that seem too good to be true especially for a vehicle you're unable to inspect. Be cautious of sellers who ask for a deposit before

purchase even if an ad seems legit.



24 March, from Hills Command

NSW residents are urged to watch out for travelling conmen in their local communities.

Beware of tradespeople quoting cheap prices for roofing work or laying bitumen for a new driveway.

They are known to insist on doing the job very quickly, demand more cash after the job is commenced or completed, or carry out inadequate or defective work in the first instance.

Conmen often move on quickly, so your town could be next on their hit list. If you have any information or think you may have been the victim of a travelling conmen, you can contact NSW Fair Trading on 13 32 20, lodge a complaint at any Service NSW Centre or via website here.


