

Giving way to other vehicles when lanes merge. Which vehicle in image one and image two have the right of way and why?



ANSWER:

Image 1: Yellow vehicle A has right of way as it is front of red vehicle and the two lanes become one without dividing lines

Image 2: Red vehicle B has the right of way as the yellow vehicle must give way as it is merging over marked lane lines.

26 March, from NSW Police: Missing girl from St Ives located safe | *Tuesday*, 26 March 2024 12:26:58 AM

A missing girl from St Ives has been located safe. The 12-year-old leaving a property on Woodbury Road, St Ives at 6:30am yesterday (Monday 25 March 2024). When she didn't return home and was unable to be located, Vienna was reported missing to officers attached to Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command, who commenced inquiries to locate her. Following inquiries, the girl was located safe and well at Ryde today (Tuesday 26 March 2024).

Police would like to thank the community and the media for their assistance.

02 April, from NSW Police: Eight people lost their lives on our roads during the Easter long weekend following a number of crashes on the state's roads, as a minority of road users continue to put themselves and others at risk through irresponsible and selfish driving behaviours [extract for Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command (PAC) - Ed]

Operation Easter 2024 commenced at 12.01am on Thursday 28 March 2024 and concluded at 11.59pm yesterday (Monday 1 April 2024), with double

demerit points in place throughout. The operation targeted the major factors contributing to road trauma – excessive speed, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, fatigue, non-wearing of seatbelts and helmets, and mobile phone use.

02 April, from NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: We were recently asked by a resident how to recognise and prevent crypto scams, a growing market We reached out to a contact at the Cybercrime Squad at NSW Police and they pointed us to the following resources (thank you, Ross). We've also included an extract from the Moneysmart webpage here, because we felt it looked like an informative read.

How crypto scams work

There are three main types of crypto scams:

- 1. investing in a fake crypto exchange, website or app
- 2. fake crypto products or jobs trading crypto

3. - using crypto to pay scammers

Fake trading platforms or fake crypto wallets

These may mimic a real online exchange or wallet, but can work in different ways:

- Phishing webpages These capture the details you enter, so the scammer can log in later and steal your crypto. They may also send links via phishing emails or pretend to be official customer support in direct messages.
- Investment opportunity You use their platform to trade or mine crypto.
 Initially, your crypto goes up in value, so you invest more. But then they lock you out, close the site and disappear with your money.
- Fake crypto trading apps Scammers create fake crypto trading apps to steal your money. The giveaway is usually that they ask you to download the app from their website. They may appear on legitimate platforms like Google Play and Apple, but are usually promptly removed. If you find one on an app store, check for overly positive reviews and be cautious.

Hi, my son's red bike (Giant) was stolen from the station. If anyone has seen it around please PM me, thanks.




01 April, from Mariana Harrison: My dad gave me this advice a long time ago when I moved into my first apartment.

A good home security tip that you may have never thought about.... Most contractors install the plates with the supplied screws which are only a half inch long and come out with one kick by a burglar. He installed 4 inch screws in their place that go through the door frame and into the framing of the house. They can kick for a long time before they get tired! You can see in the picture the screw in his hand is the screw supplied with the door hardware. Making a burglar make a bunch of noise and be foiled in their initial plan can not only give you time to arm yourself, but they will most likely move on to an easier target.

floor. Battery packs, coins etc, were not taken, so now worried that they were looking for ID or other relevant information. Could have been looking for spare car keys too, I guess.



Tips for Car Owners' (Simplified Chinese): 我们的 20 个最常用的犯罪预防提

示 车主

- 1. **在您离开您的**车辆并且车内无人时(即使很短时间),请关闭所有车窗,将车钥匙从点火处移除,并锁上车门。请牢记:根据澳大利亚交通道路管理条例,驾驶者离开无人车辆而不锁车属于违法行为。
- **2. 切勿将**备用钥匙藏在您的车辆中。千万不要大意,窃贼知道车内所有可能藏匿物品之处。
- 3. 请确保在车内的可见位置没有放置任何财物,例如:手机、太阳镜、CD(刻录光盘)、背包、钱包、零钱、衣服、笔记本电脑、iPod等。所有财物要么随身携带,要么放在车辆的储物箱内。另外,确保车内没有任何疑似财物,例如,后座上放了一条毛毯有可能让窃贼认为毛毯下可能会有手提袋等其他物品。

18. 晚上睡觉时最好将车钥匙置于床边,遥控钥匙在紧急情况下可以作为开关触发车辆报警。请勿将车钥匙放在**客**厅的桌上或厨房的台面上。**19. 在夜**间行驶时请锁好车门。当陌生人在夜间求助时,请勿下车提供帮助,而是拨打报警电话寻求援助
