18 June, from Nepean command: TRAFFIC TUESDAY – Think safety.

If you are towing anything or have anything in the tray of your ute or truck, remember to secure your load.

Loose objects bouncing around in the back of your ute or trailer can cause chaos and is dangerous for other road users if ejected from your vehicle. Failure to secure your load may result in infringements being issued. 'Drive/tow vehicle with unsecured load \$514 and 3 demerit points'. Think safety first and, no, you're not permitted to travel in the rear of your mate's ute. There are penalties for this as well.

A Cautionary Tale

One of our volunteers used the driveway stencil to paint the white lines at the edge of their driveway. They were getting fed up of being blocked in by parents attending the school nearby. One day a parent parked overhanging their driveway - not completely blocked, but very annoying and unsafe nonetheless.

So they rang the school who poo-pooed it. Not happy, they rang the Ku-ring-gai council ranger, who came and watched for the driver to return to their car. And they did. Despite pleading ignorance they were fined on the spot a significant amount. Thank you to the Ku-ring-gai council rangers for enforcing the unsafe parking.

The driveway white lines are positioned one metre from the edge of the driveway, to allow sufficient viewing when exiting the driveway. Ignoring these mean you can be in breach of the NSW Road Rule 198 Obstructing access to and from the footpath, driveway etc.

Neighbourhood Watch tips against graffiti.

- Residents are encouraged to report any new graffiti to the NSW Police via the <u>Police Community Portal</u>. You will receive an Event Number.
- Residents with any graffiti on their property are encouraged to remove it ASAP. See our <u>WatchOut.org.au/Graffiti</u> page for suggested products and/or email us how.
- Residents in a hotspot area are encouraged to use a product such as 'blood & bone' to deter congregation of youths.
- Residents are encouraged to grow a creeper (possibly one with thorns) on their walls/fences.
- Residents are encouraged to install sensor lighting and/or CCTV. Note:
 You must display a sticker saying you have CCTV on premises. It is possible to display a sticker without having any CCTV.
- Residents reporting graffiti on Transport for NSW property, please use the Snap Send Solve App.

17 June, from NSW Road Safety: Quiz time! Which sign matches the rule?




Answer: For everyone who answered B, you are correct! ✓

15 June, from Whittlesea City Neighbourhood Watch: Why did Bill separate the admin account from normal user account?



- Admin accounts have elevated privileges that can make critical changes to your computer and data. These privileges should ONLY be accessible to the owner of the computer.
- If adversaries gain access to your computer through successful phishing attacks or if you unintentionally download malware from an infected website/email while logged onto your admin account, they will then have FULL control of your computer. This will further lead to data compromise and disruption of service, etc.
- By having a separate account such as a normal user account for everyday activities, you LIMIT the attacker's access to just your local account when compromised. Therefore, reducing the impact of the threat.

The NSW Police Force CCTV Register ('the Register') is a database which has been established to record the location of CCTV installations across NSW. Information stored in the Register has been collected and will be used for operational policing purposes. We will not provide this information to a third party and we will secure this information from unauthorised access. Your consent to supply this information to us for inclusion in the CCTV Register DOES NOT mean that you consent to supply us imagery captured by, or stored on, your CCTV system/s (eg. video footage or still images). There is no obligation for you to provide information. Registration is purely voluntary.


