24 June, from Police Transport command: Police are seeking assistance from the public to identify a male who may be able to assist with their enquiries in relation to an assault which occurred at Hornsby Railway Station about 2.50pm on Friday 19 April 2024.

The male is described as Caucasian, about 185cm tall, heavy build with white hair and goatee beard. He was wearing a dark coloured cap, black sunglasses, red t-shirt with "46" on the front, black shorts and white runners. Police are appealing for anyone who may have witnessed the incident or have knowledge of the identity of the person depicted to come forward.

25 June, Shared with permission from the Pymble and West Pymble Community Group:

These are pictures of the youths who are around West Pymble on Sunday mornings usually between 10-12. They tend to walk from Todman, up Lachlan to the IGA. They have been known to smash windows, do knock and runs, throw items at cars and steal plants and packages from houses they decide to randomly target along the way. If you take a photo of them and they see you - you may become their next target!! They are intimidating! They steal food and drinks from the IGA and eat it in Yarrara walk or in the back car park. They then

catch the bus to Gordon and may or may not get kicked off the bus along the way. The police have been notified and are aware of the situation and have said we can post any photos captured on phones or security cameras in case a parent here may recognise their child and decide to do something about it?!









24 June, from NSW Health: NSW Health is asking gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men to be on the lookout for symptoms of mpox following the recent detection of new cases.

Do you know the symptoms of mpox? Most people who get mpox will experience rashes, pimple-like lesions or sores, particularly in areas that are hard to see such as the genitals, anus or buttocks. Usual symptoms also include ulcers, lesions or sores in the mouth. They usually begin 7-14 days after you've come in contact with someone with the virus. If you have mpox, you can spread it to others up until the lesions crust over and fresh skin covers the area. It's important to get help as soon as you notice symptoms. Self-isolate and call ahead to make an appointment with your doctor or sexual health clinic. Watching for symptoms and getting vaccinated if you're recommended to are important ways to keep you safe from mpox.

Symptoms of **mpox**?

- rashes, pimple-like lesions or sores, particularly in areas that are hard to see.
- > ulcers, lesions or sores in the mouth.

For some people:

> fever, headache, muscle aches, backache, swollen lymph nodes, chills and/or exhaustion.

23 June, from NSW MAritime: Quick reminder:

If your vessel is under 6 meters, make sure you've got a paddle or oars on board unless there's another way to power it. Don't get caught adrift without one!

23 June, from Traffic & Highway Patrol command: Let's talk displaying of L and P-plates.

Mt Druitt HWP will like to remind all learner and provisional licence holders how to display L and P plates to comply with legislation. The legislation states 'The holder of an Australian driver licence who fails to comply with a condition of that licence is guilty of an offence." One of the conditions is the displaying of L and P-plates. They need to be displayed conspicuously at the front and rear of a motor vehicle and in the case of a motor bike, at the rear. 'Conspicuously' means in a clearly visible way. It is important to display L and P plates as there are certain conditions on these classes licences that these drivers have to abide by. <u>Here</u> are links to Transport for NSW outlining these rules. 
- Substitution of the second o

21 June, from Whitlesea City NHW: Why is Bill so serious about securing his wireless router?

- Think of your wireless router as your digital home and the password that comes with it is the digital key that allows you to connect to the internet. Just as you wouldn't let strangers into your physical home, you shouldn't allow unauthorized access to your internet and home network.
- Apart from using your internet without your permission, if adversaries gain access to your wireless router, they could potentially ACCESS your personal data, including emails, banking information, and passwords, etc. Therefore, it is important to have SEPARATE strong passwords for your wireless router and Wi-Fi. By ensuring you have the latest firmware update on your wireless router, you REDUCE the risk of malware and viruses being installed on your device, leading to data theft, identity theft, network hijacking, or other malicious activities.
- Sy hardening your wireless router, you can PROTECT your personal information, maintain your privacy, and ensure a smooth and fast internet experience.
