363 on Friday, standing with our Commander, Detective Superintendent Scott.



19 August, from Ku-ring-gai command: Police are seeking the identity of the below female who they believe may be able to assist them with enquiries in relation to a sexual touching incident that occurred on the 2nd of July 2024, near Gordon train station.

1 Traffic is heavy, exercise caution through the area and allow extra time. More information at: livetraffic.com/incident-details/204858






20 August, from Hornsby Shire Council: We are proposing to ban cars from turning right from Buckingham Ave into Malsbury Rd, Normanhurst during peak hours to improve traffic flow and safety

We have received numerous requests from the community concerning the operation of the intersection of Buckingham Avenue with Malsbury Road. We are aware that due to the high amount of traffic along Malsbury Road and Milson Parade during peak hours, vehicles coming from Buckingham Avenue railway bridge are finding it very difficult to find a gap in traffic to turn right safely.

We had one of our cars rummaged through in Kooloona also... camera shows around 1:50am ish...






19 August, from Turramurra Neighbourhood Watch: BREAK IN -Shared by a local resident

17 August, from 9News.com.au: Student police officer charged after allegedly slamming door on woman's hand







From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Storgae Cages'

Tip #1. Storage cages in the underground car parks under unit blocks are built to a budget, not necessarily to any degree of security. Beware weak hinges, frames and wire. Have a qualified trades person inspect the cage and suggest how best to improve the security. Ensure it cannot be accessed, forced open or climbed into.

Tip #2. Triple hinge the cage, with triple locking points.



Tip #3. Use a high-quality padlock on your storage cage and use it at all times. "A lock is not a lock unless it is locked!" Research the variety of secure locking devices available. You may

as well not have a quality lock if it is not paired with a quality chain/locking device (eg padbolt, hasp & staple, etc). Cheap hardware can be cut and broken-off in seconds, with almost no noise. A padlock shackle (U-shaped loop of metal) protector helps protect it against bolt cutter attack.

Tip #4. Install good lighting.

Are you the kind of neighbour you would want? It all starts with us:


- ■Keep loud music, power tools and barking dogs to a minimum.


