08 September, from NSW Police Force

Police are appealing for witnesses following an incident at Central Railway Station last week.

About 11:40pm on Thursday 5 September 2024, officers attached to the Police Transport Command were told that a man wearing a costume similar to that worn by characters in the TV series *The Squid Game*, was on Platform 24.

A few minutes later, a train arrived on Platform 24 and the man entered one of the carriages.

Officers entered the carriage and approached the 38-year-old man.

Police will allege the man was in possession of a knife and advanced towards an officer.

The officer deployed her taser, and the man was arrested without further incident.

There were no injuries to police or passengers.

The man was taken to Prince of Wales Hospital for assessment.

As investigations continue, police are appealing for anyone who was in the area at the time and may have witnessed something to contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

A man has been charged over an alleged child grooming offence in the Kuring Gai region.

In September, officers attached to Kuring Gai Police Area Command commenced an investigation into allegations a man groomed a child online. Following inquiries, a 27-year-old man was arrested today in Wahroonga. He was charged with one count of procuring or grooming child under 16 for unlawful sexual activity.

The man was refused bail to appear at Parramatta Local Court tomorrow.

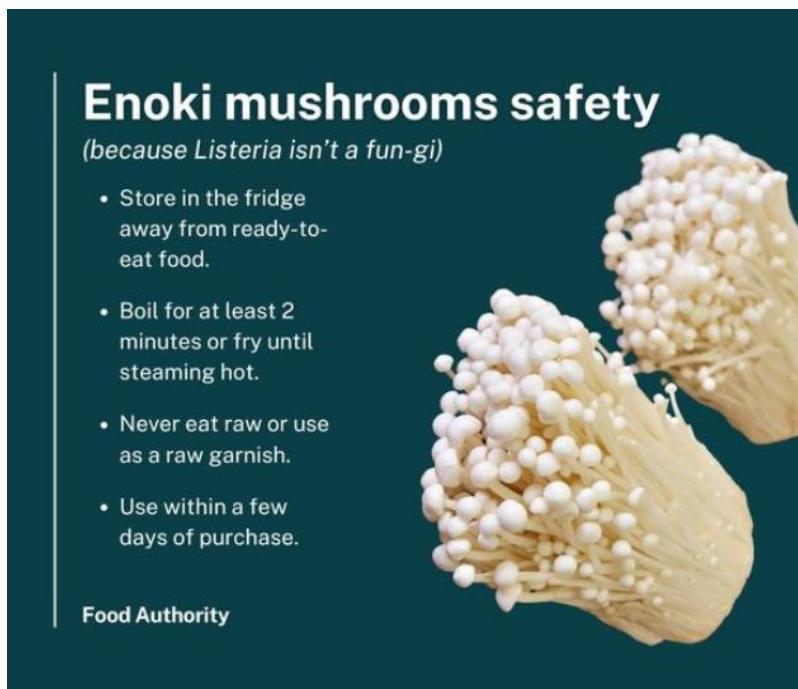

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Darug peoples as the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is reducing speed limits in some areas to provide a safer environment for pedestrians and road users.

As a result of a request from Hornsby Shire Council, the speed limit along Peats Ferry Road, Asquith will be reduced from 60km/h to 50km/h.

A safety review of this road revealed that between January 2019 to December 2023 there were 12 crashes resulting in eight injuries. The review identified the need to reduce the speed limit along Peats Ferry Road between Old Berowra Road and Jersey Street, in line with NSW Speed Zoning requirements.

What work are we doing?

The work includes:

- Installing four 50km/h signs and installing nine 50km/h speed limit signs
- Painting two numerals on asphalt
- And where we'll be working

The safety of our workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise traffic disruption, the work will take place at night.

The work will take place over **five days and four nights** between **Monday 9 September** and **Friday 13 September 2024**, weather and site conditions permitting.

Work will take place on Mondays to Fridays, 7am to 6pm, or from 8pm to 5am.

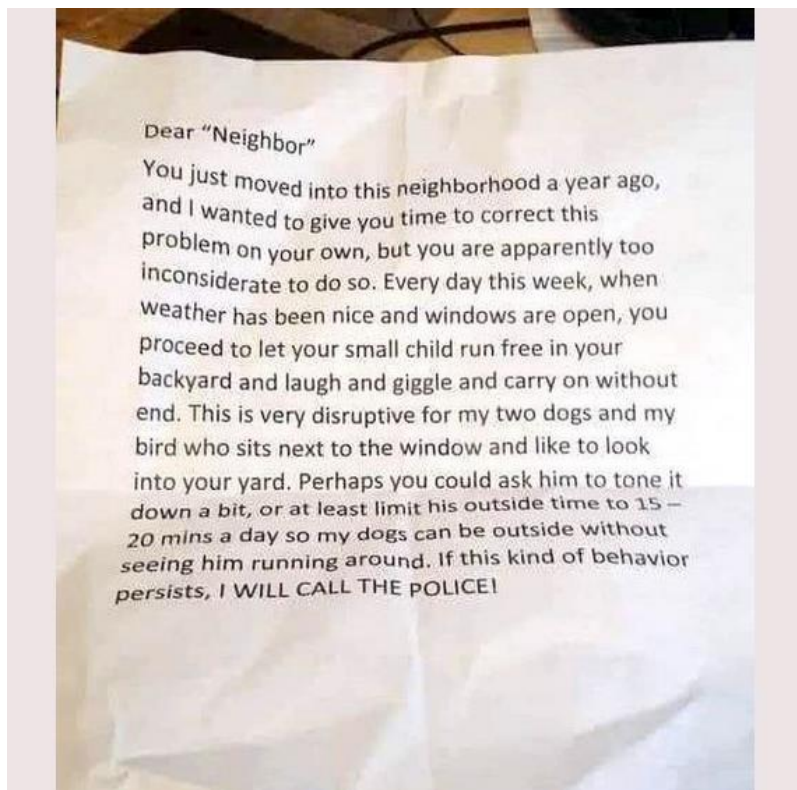

STEAL FROM MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENCES ARE STILL OCCURRING
THROUGHOUT THE COMMAND

WHAT DO THEY STEAL FROM YOUR CAR?

They steal coins from the console, sunnies, documentation showing your personal details, mobile phones, laptops, wallets, tools, GPS units. Anything they can see, they'll steal.

Your bank cards are then used to steal your money.

You are left with the inconvenience of cancelling the cards, making a police report, applying for a new licence and waiting for the new licence and cards to be activated.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Remember to lock cars, windows and doors – even when parked on your property in your driveway.

In many of the steal from motor vehicle incidents, the cars have been unlocked at the time.

Just take that extra few seconds to ensure your vehicle is locked. These criminals always prefer an unlocked vehicle as to gain entry means less noise.

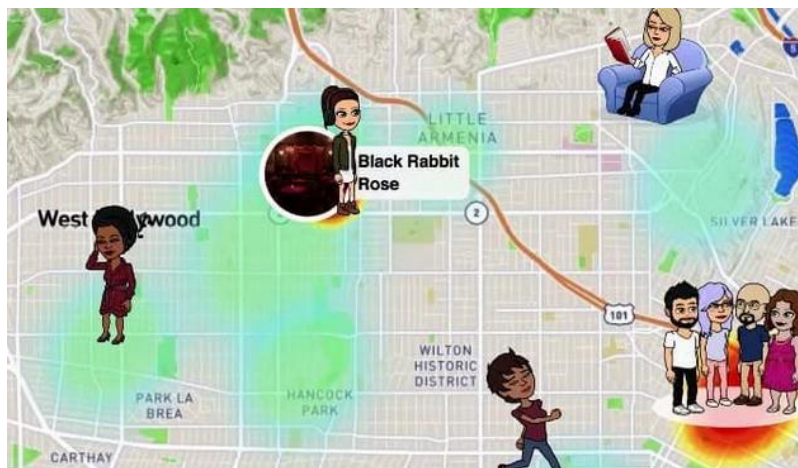

Two males have been arrested following an attempted break-in and pursuit with a stolen vehicle in Sydney's north.

About 1.15am (today Friday 6 September 2024) two males were allegedly disturbed during a break and enter at a home on Seaforth Crescent, Seaforth where they fled the scene in a Toyota Camry.

A short time later officers from the Traffic and Highway Patrol Command sighted the vehicle travelling east along Military Road, Mosman, in excess of the 60km/h posted speed limit.

When the vehicle failed to stop as directed a pursuit was initiated.

It will be alleged that speeds of over 90kph in a 60km/h zone were reached, before the driver stopped the vehicle along the Warringah Freeway, North Sydney, and ran from the scene.

After a short foot pursuit, the 19-year-old man was arrested with the assistance of the Dog Squad.

He was treated at the scene for a dog bite to the right leg and taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a stable condition where he remains under police guard.

A male passenger was arrested in the vehicle. The 17-year-old was taken to Manly Police Station and is assisting with inquiries.

As detectives from Northern Beaches Police Area Command continue with investigations, anyone with information about the matter – or has any available dashcam/mobile phone footage – is urged to contact Manly Police Station or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

This week is National Child Protection week.

We ask that all parents monitor their child's online activity to limit any online harm.

"TakeltDown" is a free online service that can be used to help limit the spread of nude images online. TakeltDown provides participating online platforms with

a unique code that identifies the image and then action can be taken to have that image removed.

Many other online websites such as ThinkUknow, the Esafety Commissioner and the Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCCE) websites are useful websites for everyone to also be aware of.

Take It Down

Sharing nude images online is scary, but there is hope to get it taken down.

Take It Down is a free service that can help you stop the online sharing of nude, partially nude or sexually explicit images or videos taken of you when you were under 18 years old.

Here's how it works:
Visit TakeItDown.NCMEC.org and click on "Get Started".

1. It's a few simple questions.
2. Select the image or video on your device that you're concerned about.
3. Take It Down will create a unique digital fingerprint called a hash value for your image or video.

The hash will be shared with participating online platforms that can use it to detect copies of these images or videos on their services and take action to remove the content or limit the spread. This all happens without the image or video ever leaving your device or anyone viewing it, and you don't have to share any personal information.

Remember, losing control of your image could happen to anyone, and you're not alone. For more information about how NCMEC can help, visit TakeItDown.NCMEC.org

HOW TO GET HELP AND SUPPORT

Remember that nothing is so bad that you can't tell someone. Ask for help if something goes wrong online; you don't need to manage these issues alone. There are many options to report crime as well as support services.

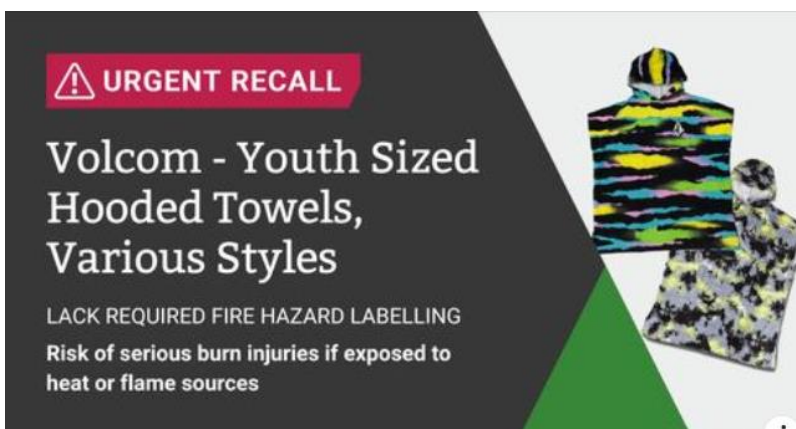
