11 September, from Ku-ring-gai command Elderly community members are being targeted by persons posing as an employee from technology companies.

These persons are calling and convincing victims that their credit cards have been compromised, and that they should leave them in their letterbox for collection. The credit cards are then taken and then used to withdraw large amounts of cash. For those followers whose elderly friends and relatives may not be connected to social media, please have a chat to them about this.

17 September, from Hornsby Shire Council: A Potts Hill man was fined \$4,750 for illegally dumping almost 2 tonnes of building and renovation waste at James Henty Drive Oval, Dural.

The homeowner had done the right thing and paid for their waste to be disposed of legally, but sadly the waste was dumped at the local park instead. The large waste piles and other pieces of gyprock and rubbish scattered around the local field and park, making it dangerous and difficult for the community to use.

How to stop this happening?

When getting someone to remove waste:

- receive a tax invoice

The vehicle driven by said Ravenswood student is a dark grey Mercedes with red Ps displayed, number plate with some of these digits & letters IB? 26B.

This matter was reported to Police. Ravenswood School are still looking into the matter. If anyone recognises the vehicle/number plate please come forward to assist with the inquiry. Owner doesn't want Police to fine student for leaving the scene, but would like the damage paid for and the person to face the consequences. Thank you for any insight.

12 September, from NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: From the NSW Police website: To register a party, as well as safe party tips.

For your information we have listed some suggestions for you to consider when having a party or gathering. By following the advice below, you can help minimise the risks and help make your party successful, enjoyable and a safe time for everyone.

Before the party

- Let the police know that you are having a party by completing the Party Registration
 Form online. Access the form through the NSW Police Force website and lodge at least 72 hours prior to the party being held.
- Consider how the party will be advertised. Don't use Internet, SMS or email distribution lists, online notice boards or social networking sites. If word of the party has spread, you will need to take extra preventative measures (ie. Change venue, more adult supervisors, hire a security guard, ask neighbours to notify you of any unusual behaviour).
- Guest lists should be kept to a manageable size. If you are hosting a young person's
 party, and you are expecting a large number of people, consider asking other
 responsible adults to assist with supervision, or consider hiring security officers.
- Consider numbering your invitations or have the guests produce their invitation at the
 door in order to get entry. Accompany this with a door list to ensure only those invited
 are allowed to enter. This is relevant for adolescent parties.
- Ask your guests to ensure that other people are not invited without the host's permission....

The question has been asked! Can you use your mobile phone when in a drive-thru of a fast-food outlet?




ANSWER

You are able to use a mobile phone if,

- (a) the vehicle is stationary in a road related area, and
- (b) the phone--
- (i) is functioning as a payment device to enable the driver to pay for goods or services that are required to be paid for in the road related area, or
- (ii) is being used to display an electronic coupon, voucher, card or similar article that requires the body of the phone to be held in close proximity to another device located in the road related area in order for the article to be used or redeemed, or
- (iii) is being used as an electronic device that enables the driver to enter another road related area or land adjacent to the road related area.

11 September, from Burwood command: Help Police identify these Blessing Scam Offenders.

Police are investigating 'Chinese blessing scams' or 'ghost scams' across multiple Metro Police Area Commands in Sydney. In the past 11 months there have been 20 incidents reported in Metro Sydney where elderly Asian females have been targeted through this scam. Total losses for victims of this scam are estimated to be over a million dollars. At this time no arrests have been made and the identity of the offenders remains unknown.

The offenders target human vulnerabilities by instilling fear in vulnerable elderly Asian females who speak limited English and may not have access to the internet or social media. Victims are approached in public places such as parks, markets, train stations and are persuaded to withdraw large amounts of cash and/or hand over their cash or jewellery. The offenders may be operating as part of a larger criminal syndicate however they appear to be working in groups of 3s and the victims targeted are from middle age to 60-years-old. In almost every incident the initial interaction with the victim is based on the first offender's knowledge of a healer or a doctor who practices traditional Eastern medicine. Within a few

minutes 2 x other offenders join into their conversation and as a group they persuade the elderly Asian female victim to provide her valuables blessing, get rid of the evil spirit and/or convince the victim that her family member of hers needs urgent healing to prevent an imminent calamity. The victim hands over her belongings, cash, and jewellery, in a bag which is swapped by the offenders during the 'blessing' ceremony. Once the valuables are handed over, the offenders disappear. A while later or at a time/ date instructed by the offenders, the victim opens the bag and realises that she has been scammed. This scam is likely to be under reported as the victims are less likely to go to the Police or warn their communities due to language barriers and the fear their actions would be a cause to bring personal shame.


