06 October, from Traffic and Highway Patrol Command - NSW Police Force: LABOUR DAY LONG WEEKEND - P1 LICENCE HOLDER DETECTED AT 180KM/H.

About 8:30am on the 5th of October 2024, Albury HWP were conducting patrols of the Olympic Highway, Gerogery where they detected a silver coloured Holden Commodore being driven by a 21 year old P1 licence holder, travelling at 180km/h.

After stopping the vehicle, Police discovered the driver was not displaying P plates and the vehicle was in poor condition.

The driver was issued infringement notices for P1 licence holder exceed speed limit by more than 45km/h, Not display P plates and Use vehicle not comply with standard, totalling \$3415 and 14 demerit points due to the double demerit points period.

The drivers licence was suspended for a period of 6 months and the vehicle issued a defect notice.

P1 licence holders are subject to a maximum speed limit of 90km/h.

If there was ever a photo to remind you of the importance of child safety inside your vehicle, then this is it.


A child has miraculously survived with just minor cuts after a collision left the car they were travelling in a total wreck. When you take a closer look at the picture, you can see the child's car seat unscathed in the back.

"The collision highlighted the significant importance of child car seats being secured and the child appropriately fastened, which was thankfully the case in this instance," NSW Police Force officials said.

07 October, from abc.net.au: Australia detects the first case of the highly transmissible COVID-19 strain dubbed XEC



A new highly transmissible variant of COVID-19 has been detected in Australia, raising questions about whether it will lead to a wave of COVID-19 cases over summer.

The XEC strain has been reported in 29 countries including the United States, United Kingdom and China, according to global health data platform GISAID.

Here's what we know about the XEC variant and how many cases have been reported in Australia.

What do we know about XEC?

XEC is a "recombinant" COVID-19 variant, which means it's a mix of two previous Omicron subvariants called KS 1.1 and KP 3.3.

A recombinant variant is created when someone is infected with two strains of a virus that go on reproduce and create another strain.

There are conflicting reports about where the strain originated, but most suggest it was first detected in Germany in May or June.




Silver ring found in Woolworths Chatswood East Carpark (near Eastern Valley Way) inside reads "Macy & Dennis", a date also engraved.




06 October, from Thornleigh Neighbourhood Watch: A resident has contacted us: Hi.

A <u>Sydney</u> father-of-two is trying to recuperate \$25,000 in legal fees after becoming embroiled in a defamation lawsuit, sparked by a Facebook comment left by a stranger.

Andy Leonard, 45, was an administrator of a private Facebook group about surrogate parenting when he was sued for a comment he didn't write in 2023.

The post had named a person in a negative light to its less than 240 followers and had only

been viewed by six people, but unbeknownst to Leonard that comment would lead to a legal nightmare.




Does anyone know these boys? They have been causing problems with knock and run and vandalism the past week.
