6th June: DRUGS in our area, Teen dead. Please read the story. A warning to all parents and teens.

Drugs can and do cause harm to people, sometimes it ends in the death of someone. In this case a 17 year old male ingested what is believed to be an LSD tab. The effects of this drug on this youth resulted in his death. Illegal drugs of any kind are a cocktail of chemicals. These chemicals effect different people in different ways. Some of the chemicals are caustic AKA cleaning agents. There is a lot of info on this subject. If you have a problem or know of someone who does please get help and advice on how to kick the habit. Parents talk to your kids, educate them and discuss the issue. Don't think "my family is immune I come from a good family" Or "I know my kids". Talk to them. Also prescription medication is prescribed to a particular person for a reason. If prescription medication is taken by others is is not only illegal it is also unsafe. And never mix alcohol and drugs.

Police issue drug warning after death of teenager

The Drug Squad has today issued a drug warning after the death of a teenager who ingested a substance allegedly sold to him as LSD. Police from North Shore LAC - NSW Police Force were called to a home at **Killara** last night after **a 17-year-old boy** fell to his death from a third-floor balcony at his home. Officers were told the teenager had ingested a tab of LSD and had been acting out of character prior to his death. A brief is being prepared for the information of the Coroner who will determine the cause of death.

An 18-year-old man has been arrested and charged by North Shore Local Area Command with supplying a prohibited drug and was granted conditional bail to appear at Hornsby Local Court on 3 July 2013. Police are continuing their inquiries into the origin of the substance and anticipate further arrests.

Drug Squad Commander, Detective Superintendent Nick Bingham, said police have received a number of reports in recent months of teenagers and young adults acting recklessly after ingesting 25B-NBOMe and 25I-NBOMe, synthetic hallucinogenic substances available online and marketed as mimicking the effects of LSD.

The exact substance the teenage boy ingested yesterday is still to be determined but Det Supt Bingham said his behaviour was similar to that exhibited by others who had taken 25B-NBOMe and 25I-NBOMe.

5th June: New figures released by the NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics (BOCSAR) on major offences across NSW show that overall, crime is continuing to fall. The NSW Police Commissioner, Andrew Scipione, has welcomed the new results which show only two... out of 17 major crime categories are trending up and the results are similar to the March 2012 quarter result. The two major categories which have increased over the last two years are:

- *domestic-violence related assault is up 4.8 per cent and

- *fraud is 18.1 per cent;

The report states that a significant component of the increase in fraud includes the theft of credit

cards and petrol thefts driven by high fuel prices. For more

5th June, spotted by one of our volunteers: Man questioned about NSW break-ins after arrest in Victoria

A man taken into custody by Victorian Police has been questioned by NSW detectives about a series of break-ins, where the total proceeds taken were in excess of \$1 million. On Monday (3 June 2013), Victorian Police arrested a 39-year-old Umina man with 17 charges relating to 8 burglaries across Melbourne, dating back to 2009. Yesterday (Tuesday 4 June 2013), detectives from Rose Bay Local Area Command travelled to Melbourne and interviewed the man in relation to a number of break-ins within New South Wales. The burglaries being investigated by NSW targeted the affluent areas of Vaucluse, Breakfast Point and **Hornsby**. The proceeds of these offences are alleged to be over \$1 million worth of cash and jewellery. Rose Bay police also executed two search warrants in Ocean Beach Road, Umina, and William Street, Leichhardt, where a number of items were seized. They also seized a small amount of prohibited drugs and steroids. NSW police are continuing to investigate further offences committed by the man and will seek to extradite him to face charges in New South Wales.

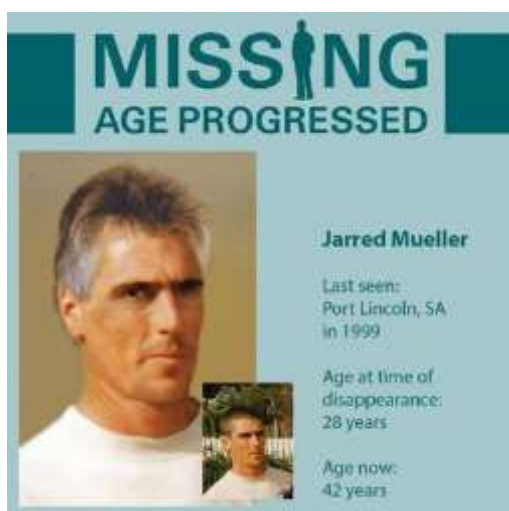
From our neighbouring Brisbane Water LAC: MALE WANTED FOR QUESTIONING - BREAK ENTER AND STEAL

The NSW Government has announced a reward of \$100,000 for information relating to the 1982 bombings of the Israeli Consulate in Sydney and the Hakoah Club at Bondi. Police from the NSW Police Force and the Australian Federal Police attached to the NSW Joint Counter Terrorism Team investigating the 1982 bombings of the Israeli Consulate in Sydney and the Hakoah Club at Bondi, will also release new information about the investigation. Through the course of the re-investigation into the bombings **further information has come to light** which could hold the key to identifying those responsible. The bombings, both on 23 December 1982, at the office of the Israeli Consulate General in William Street, Sydney, and in a vehicle parked in a car park of the Hakoah Club, 61-67 Hall Street, Bondi, caused significant damage. As a result of the blast at the Israeli Consulate, two people were injured.



Police are appealing for the public's help to find missing teenager Tamica Nelson. Tamica, 17, has an intellectual disability and requires regular insulin injections for diabetes. She was last seen on Tuesday 28 May, after having gone shopping at Macarthur Square in Campbelltown. The teenager did not return to her home in Raby that evening and she has not been seen or heard from since. There are grave concerns for her welfare as she is thought to have only limited medication with her.

Tamica is described as Caucasian appearance, slim build, 165 cm tall with shoulder length brown hair. She was last seen wearing an orange-coloured baseball cap, white singlet top overlayed with another singlet top with colourful writing on the front, blue jeans and joggers. Anyone with information about her whereabouts is urged to contact Campbelltown Police or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

From our neighbouring Eastwood NHW: Children at Risk - SEXTING

Sexting is sending nude or semi-nude photos by mobile phone, or posting sexual images on social networking sites like Facebook or Myspace. Often teens send explicit images to a partner or friend for their eyes only. Or in a moment of blurred judgement, they let someone take pictures of them that they might otherwise not agree to. What can potentially happen next is:

Harrassment or cyber-stalking; threats to share the images publicly

Outing; posting or sharing the images publicly

Impersonation; pretending to be the person who created the image, and posting or sharing it publicly, often with the suggestion that the person is interested in sexual contact.

Why are children sexting? Flirtacious gameplaying, peer pressure and competition are common motivation. In two surveys a majority of ten girls and boys claimed they sent sexually suggestive content to be "**fun or flirtacious**".

SEXTING is a criminal activity. For the person forwarding or taking the images, sexting is a criminal activity. Taking a sexual image of a minor and then texting it is **creating, holding and distributing child pornography**, even if the person committing the offence is a child. In some states if a person is convicted of child pornography offences they may be registered as a sexoffender for the next 20-30 years!

For the victim, the damage can be as severe as other forms of bullying, sexual harassment and abuse. Consequences include poor self-esteem and self-image, isolating behaviours, truancy or avoidance of school, eating disorders, self-harm and even some cases of suicide. The consequences can be permanent. **Once an image has been posted online it is very difficult to get it back.** This means the image could be circulating as teens start applying for jobs and meetign potential long-term partners.

How can you protect your teen? Ensure your child understands that once an image is sent it can't be retrieved. Not only will it be available for others to see now, but also in years to come. Encourage open discussion with your child about who they're talking to online and what sites they visit. If need be seek assistance from the following service: **Parent Line NSW - 13 20 55.**
