- 1. Julian ran the meeting: Introductions. Back story.
- 2. Known issues Graffiti along Pennant Hills Rd (PHR), Normanhurst, Pennant Hills & Thornleigh since Dec 2023.
- 3. Wishlist:
 - Act as a community to remove the graffiti.
 - Suggested date for a Blitz morning of Saturday 03 August 2024.

ENGLISH

- 30 people have pledged interest in volunteering. Volunteers to include pupils from local schools interested in Duke of Ed service.
- Graffiti Blitz to include a BBQ or similar as a thank you to those who volunteered.
- Possibility of a regular Task Force to be created following the Blitz.
- Discussion on costs & suggestion that Hornsby Council may be able to assist –
 Sallianne to take to council.
- Discussion on Transport for NSW role Julia confirmed they act on reports via 'Snap Send Solve' App. Sallianne confirmed Hornsby Council does not use this App due to associated costs.
- 4. Roger Norman: explained his role and the products, techniques utilised.
 - Suggests groups of 3-4 volunteers is more effective than 10 cleaning at a hotspot.
 - Suggests to ignore the graffiti above eyelevel. Note: Jo is still interested in removing graffiti above the awnings possibility of a professional painter/SES as a volunteer.
 - Suggests any future Task Force should attempt to clean within 3-5 days, 10 at most, to discourage more graffiti.
 - Suggests that all graffiti must be cleaned at a hotspot (ie leave nothing).
 - Cleaning /painting should be "as if it is our own property".
 - Suggests the project needs a 'champion' to succeed, who will plan, organise & supervise, rather than doing the removal possibly Sallianne?
 - Painting can be done over painted surfaces colour-matching needs to be done prior to the Blitz.
 - Non-porous surfaces (eg signs, bins, electrical kiosks) require 'Graffiti Removal Solution Spray' then rubbed off with a rag.
 - Porous surfaces (eg brick/sandstone/unpainted fences) need the strong solution applied, left and removed with a water-blaster only to be used by trained persons.
 - Note: Graffiti Removal Solution is not harmful, but may sting if in a cut. Wear goggles to protect eyes.
 - **5. Roger's plan of attack:** (Roger's Notes were supplied writer lost her copy)
 - Inspect the area to plan and ID sites. Note: You require the property owner/occupier's (verbal is OK) consent.
 - ID the colour-matched paints for supply.
 - ID supplies necessary for volunteers (spray bottles with solution, rags, rubber gloves, paper overalls, brushes, goggles & access to water & soap).
 - Suggests Box A (painted surface) & Box B (solution work) for on Blitz day.

6. Jo Hutchens:

- Jo spoke about her vision of lifting the area.
- Jo spoke about her graffiti incident, and discussions retailers had with police & council. Police advised fast removal of the graffiti and that retailers get CCTV and improve lighting.
- Jo noted how it is easier to remove new graffiti and prevents "over-tagging" by other gangs.
- It was noted that Hornsby Council may be able to improve lighting as part of its beautification programme.
- The criminals wore black hoodies and face masks and couldn't be identified from the available CCTV.

7. Daniel Petrucci:

Daniel spoke about his efforts to get council to enforce removal of graffiti by

residents, especially investment properties that he had researched and found were owned by the one family - Sallianne would love to hear more about this.

- He supports a Task Force to help the elderly & disabled.
- Daniel has access to legal expertise.
- 8. Alex Walsh: asked several questions.
 - She mentioned on querying with the police only 5 reports were logged, but 15 were known by Daniel.
 - Discussion about offenders doing Community Service Roger stated timing and supervision is the problem.
 - Alex questioned preventative measures, eg stop how the youths were accessing paints.
 - She suggested that residents should have access to this info from Roger, eg through council, to inform residents what they can do, and how to report it.
 - Discussion about the use of Snap Send Solve app for reporting to Transport for NSW.
- 9. Matt: to liaise with Roger about a training session(s) & Bunnings supplies.
 - Happy with a Blitz day, but concerned about moving forward.
 - Suggestion for multiple satellite packs around the neighbourhood, eg at sporting clubs. Sallianne to discuss with council possibility of mini-trailer kits being kept at the council depot.
 - Matt mentioned graffiti on Duffy Avenue also out of control.
 - Matt & Daniel cannot help on the Blitz day, but would like it made into a week & thus able to be involved.
- **10. Julia:** questioned insurance cover. Possibility it is arranged as a Rotary or Council event.

11. Next steps:

- Need a volunteer to identify the hotspots needing cleaning on the day of the Blitz
- Need paint colour-matching for hotspot sites.
- Need a volunteer to get funding/donations.
- Need training from Roger of volunteers. Matt to coordinate?
- Need to identify a 'champion' & supervisors for key areas.
- Need a volunteer to get donation of supplies form stores eg Bunnings.
- Roger Norman to approach his supplier of 'Solution' in S.A.
- Need an organisation to back the Blitz possibly Hornsby Rotary?
- Need a volunteer to organise refreshments/lunch/BBQ, or have a café/business involved?
- Jo to talk to local retailers about using the courtyard for lunch/BBQ.
- Sallianne to approach Hornsby Council for assistance and advice.
- Everybody to ask their organisations for volunteers for the Blitz day.
- Julian to send a follow-up email to his distribution list, to publicise the event & request volunteers.

12. NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby/Julia Action:

- Write up notes and report on meeting to the local police/residents.
- Write up NHW suggestions to assist the community & share with Julian.
- Possibly provide NHW garbage bin stickers for after removal of graffiti?

- Share news of the issue & date of Blitz to community via Facebook, weekly eNewsletter and website. Suggest reporting to police via Portal.
- Invite volunteers to assist with Blitz.
- Julia to assist local police with a 'Community Alert' for graffiti crime, for potential letterbox drops.
- NHW K&H volunteers to assist with 'cocooning' letterbox drops to residents around hotspots.
- 13. Pre-meeting: Julia to introduce Jo via email to CPO at Hornsby police station.
- 14. Post-meeting: Julia to list tips as suggestions to residents & send to Julian:
 - a) Apply a 'blood & bone' type product to put off the congregation of youths at hotspots.
 - b) Apply a NHW garbage sticker (to smooth surface) after cleaning graffiti at hotspots.
 - c) Where possible, grow a plant such as a creeper (or a plant with thorns?) to cover the wall being graffitied.
 - d) Look at introducing sensor lighting and CCTV. Note: You must display a sticker saying you have CCTV on premises. Possible to display a sticker without having any CCTV.
 - e) Easy reporting via Police Community Portal & receive Event Number.
 - NHW volunteers to assist with 'cocooning' the local hotspots with letterbox drops of a police 'Community Alert' created specifically for graffiti crime (encouraging residents to report ASAP/clean ASAP).
 - NHW to inform public of use of Snap Send Solve to report graffiti to Transport to NSW. Inform public of other methods, for other property.

15. Notes:

- Julia is in process of updating the 'Reporting Crime in Ku-ring-gai' flyer with Ku-ring-gai Council, to include the police Community Portal as a method for reporting crime, eg graffiti. Potential for Hornsby Council to produce something similar?
- Can police task more cars to drive along PHR?
- The annual 'Graffiti Removal Day' is no longer in existence.
- The <u>NSW Bureaux of Crime Statistics and Research</u> indicates that crime is actually generally stable in our area.
