13 December, from Ku-ring-gai command: New legislation was introduced on the 9th of December 2024 which means increased penalties apply for anyone selling knives to anyone under 16 years of age and making it illegal to sell a knife to anyone 16 or 17 without a reasonable excuse.

Police have the power to use metal-detecting wands to search for knives in public places such as train stations, shopping centres, sporting venues or late night entertainment hubs.

DON'T RUIN YOUR LIFE

BY CARRYING A KNIFE

Carrying a knife for self-defence in a public place or school is illegal.

If Police have reasonable grounds to suspect you may be carrying a knife in a public place or school they can legally search you.

You could face up to 4 years in prison for carrying a knife in a public place or school without a reasonable excuse.



New legislation as of 9 December 2024

Amendments to the *Summary Offences Act 1988* that coincide with the new knife crime laws:

- increased penalties apply for selling knives to anyone under 16 years of age, and
- making it illegal to sell a knife to anyone 16 or 17 years of age, without a reasonable excuse.

The penalty for selling a knife to a child is now \$11,000 and/or 12 months imprisonment.

From 9 December 2024

- It's illegal to sell a knife to anyone under 16 years of age.
- It's illegal to sell a knife to anyone that is aged 16 or 17 without a reasonable excuse.
- Fines up to \$11,000 or 12 months imprisonment (or both).

17 December, from NSW Police: As of December 1, 2024, the definition of stalking has been broadened.

It now encompasses monitoring or tracking a person's activities, communications, or movements using technology or other methods. It includes situations where there is no direct contact or approach to the person being monitored.

- Follow someone
- Show up at places they often visit
- Send them unwanted messages
- Monitor or track their movements*

*whether or not the monitoring or tracking involves technology, contacting or otherwise approaching the person.



17 December, from Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: The last of the speakers' reports from the Neighbourhood Watch - Gordon/Neighbourhood Watch - Killara/Neighbourhood Watch East Killara AGM last month.

6. Speaker: Captain Andrew Wilson, Killara Rural Fire Brigade -

Andrew spoke about the demarcation between the Rural Fire Service (Bush) and Fire and Rescue (built-up areas), the history of our local group and the new RFB station at 26A Koola Av, East Killara, which officially opens in 2025. Of note:

- a. The station is fully operational and has already responded 3 times: a bush fire in Roseville Chase, a small vegetation fire in West Pymble and assisting Ambulance NSW extract an injured person from a fire trail in E. Lindfield.
- b. The local service started in St Ives in the 1970s. They moved to Golden Jubilee, Wahroonga. It has taken 6½ years to get this new station at East Killara.
- c. Killara have 50 volunteers and 2 tankers. They also assist with storm damage, flood recovery and back-burning, hosing of houses, search & rescue in the bush, and community engagement.

Andrew encouraged residents to:

- d. Know the risks in your area. Have a plan ready and discuss it with those that live with you, so everyone is aware of that plan and an alternative.
- e. Prepare your property, eg overhanging branches, rubbish, inflammables, etc. See the RFS Bush Fire Service website: rfs.nsw.gov.au/resources/bush-fire-survival-plan

- f. Keep up-to-date if there is a bushfire. Use the Hazards Near Me App: <https://www.nsw.gov.au/emergency/hazards-near-me-app> This app is extremely timely – the information is shared by RFS volunteers as soon as they are at the site.

Andrew is happy to attend any community meetings. He answered several residents' questions – about an Evacuation Plan for WIRES, use of 'Rural' in their title and the renaming of each local group from 'Service' to 'Brigade'.

ਈ-ਸੁਰੱਖਿਆ ਕਮਿਸ਼ਨਰ (eSafety) ਅਤੇ ਆਸਟ੍ਰੇਲੀਅਨ ਫੈਡਰਲ ਪੁਲਿਸ ਦੀ ਅਗਵਾਈ ਵਾਲੇ ਬਾਲ ਸ਼ੋਸ਼ਣ ਦਾ ਮੁਕਾਬਲਾ ਕਰਨ ਵਾਲੇ ਆਸਟ੍ਰੇਲੀਆਈ ਕੇਂਦਰ (Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation, ACCCE) ਨੇ ਪਰਿਵਾਰਾਂ ਨੂੰ ਔਨਲਾਈਨ ਸੁਰੱਖਿਆ ਬਾਰੇ ਅਹਿਮ ਗੱਲਾਂ ਕਰਨ ਵਿੱਚ ਮੱਦਦ ਕਰਨ ਲਈ ਇਹ ਸਰੋਤ ਬਣਾਇਆ ਹੈ।

12 December, from the Australian Federal Police: Is your child a gamer?

We're encouraging parents and guardians to talk to their kids these school holidays to help them understand the risks of DDoS attacks. Not sure what DDoS is? It stands for **Distributed Denial of Service** and it's an illegal practice that disrupts the normal functioning of a website or online service by overwhelming it with a flood of web traffic from multiple sources, stopping people from accessing it. Some gamers misuse DDoS tools to gain an unfair advantage by temporarily booting competitors off an online game. This is illegal and can have serious consequences. Additionally, criminals often convince gamers into downloading cheat tools that install malicious software (malware) on their computer. This malware can secretly use their device to help launch DDoS attacks on others. Follow these tips to protect your home computer and devices, and enjoy safe (and legal) gaming:

- Keep security software up to date
- Avoid clicking links in chats

- Download games, mods, and tools only from official, trusted sources
- Promote fair play – never use DDoS tools

DRINK SPIKING



Drink spiking is when someone deliberately adds alcohol or another drug to your drink without your knowledge and it is illegal in all Australian states and territories.

When you're out at a pub, club or party protect yourself:

- Watch your drinks
- avoid sharing drinks
- if someone you don't know well offers you a drink, go to the bar with them
- many people have their drinks spiked by someone they know: to avoid this, buy or pour your own drinks
- keep an eye on your friends and their drinks.

Drink spiking is serious: In an emergency, telephone triple zero (000) or the nearest police station. For information about sexual assault, or for counselling or referral, call **1800RESPECT**.

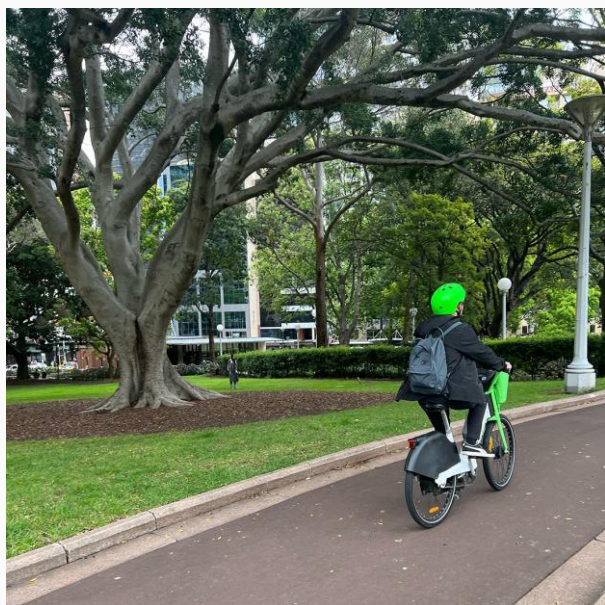

- DO** be mindful of what personal information you share online.
- DO NOT** access email or text message links from senders you don't know.
- DO** screenshot messages or transactions to keep a record in case you are scammed.
- DO NOT** accept 'friend' requests or respond to messages from people you don't know.
- DO** report the matter to the NSW Police Force if you become the victim of a fraud.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Frequently Asked Questions #7: WHAT SHOULD I DO WHEN MY PET GOES MISSING?

1. Begin searching for your pet IMMEDIATELY! Do not wait in the hope that they will find their own way home. The whole time your pet is missing they are at risk of being hurt by a car, or person, or another animal and at risk of getting sick, dehydrating or starving. Consider this an EMERGENCY!
2. Ask neighbours to check backyards, under decks, subfloor access areas, sheds & garages just-in-case your pet was accidentally locked in. Search 3 blocks in each direction from where they were last seen.
3. Contact all animal shelters, council pounds & vets – even the ones outside of your area.
