Reports cannot be accepted by email or over the phone.


If you are unable to get to a Police station, Police may be able to travel to you. Call your nearest Police station for advice.

30 January, from Ku-ring-gai Command: Older Chinese Women are being targeted in Chinese Blessing Scams.

Scammers are stealing money and jewellery from women they meet on the street by saying they need a blessing to protect their family from a curse or illness.

BEWARE of people asking for directions to a Chinese Herbal Doctor or Spiritual Healer.

DO NOT follow people you have just met to a Doctor or Healer.

DO NOT bring strangers home.

DO NOT hand over money, jewellery, or valuable items or strangers.

DO NOT put money or jewellery in a bag for any blessing ritual.

THIS IS A SCAM. Call police and tell family before losing money or jewellery.



30 January, from Ku-ring-gai Command: We know we can become complacent in securing our homes and vehicles. There have been numerous incidents of break and enter offences in our command whereby offenders are entering via unlocked front and back doors.

Locking our doors is a simple task that can prevent this from occurring. Please try to remember: LOCK IT, ALARM IT, LIGHT IT, RECORD IT.



29 January, from Australian Federal Police: 4 Content warning.

The AFP-led Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCCE) has seen an increase in the use of artificial intelligence (AI) to generate child abuse material.


Using AI to create material featuring the abuse of someone under 18 could be a criminal offence and classified as creating child abuse material. It doesn't matter if it's a video, image, drawing or story, or if it's 'real' or not.

One thing that has emerged is a rise in students creating material such as deepfakes for a range of reasons, including to harass or embarrass classmates. The AFP is urging parents and carers to have open and non-judgemental conversations with their children about the dangers and harms caused by using AI.

Warning over rise in Al-generated child abuse material





03 February, from NSW Police Force: Fatal Crash - Macquarie Park

A driver has died after a single vehicle crash in Sydney's north west.

About 1.35pm today (Monday 3 February 2025), emergency services responded to reports of a green convertible colliding with a barrier at the intersection of Delhi Road and the M2, Macquarie Park.

Officers from Ryde Police Area Command and NSW Ambulance paramedics performed CPR on the 83-year-old male driver but he died at the scene.

A 14-year-old male passenger in the vehicle was uninjured. He was taken to Randwick Children's Hospital as a precaution.

A crime scene has been established and an investigation into the incident has commenced.

Traffic diversion are currently in place and motorists are urged to avoid the area.

A report will be prepared for the information of the coroner.

Police are urging anyone who may have witnessed the incident – or has any available dashcam/mobile phone footage – to contact Ryde Police Station or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

03 February, from Hornsby Shire Council



A Castle Hill vehicle owner was recently fined \$8,000 for transporting illegally dumped waste. The vehicle was used to transport a large fridge and freezer, which were then dumped on top of existing rubbish in Asquith. Did you know that fines for transporting waste to unlawful locations have increased significantly over the past year? These fines apply to illegal dumpers, the original owners of the waste, and even the vehicle owners used to transport it.

⚠The vehicle owner also failed to comply with a legal notice to provide documents and answer questions, which can result in an extra on-the-spot fine of \$15,000 for individuals or \$30,000 for businesses.

When hiring someone to remove waste, remember to:

- Ask where the waste is going
- Request proof of insurance

If you see illegal dumping in Hornsby Shire, report it straight away by calling Council's Waste Hotline at 13 70 30.

03 February, from East Killara Neighbourhood Watch







Just wanted to let everyone know that I had my car broken into last night. I live on Mudies Rd. I've reported it to the police. Nothing of value was taken. Both glove boxes were rifled through and the doors left open to avoid the noise of closing them. The thieves are obviously experienced and it is likely they roam the streets looking testing cars and possibly houses for unlocked doors. There was no evidence of forced entry so it is likely I accidentally left my car unlocked or the button didn't activate when I thought I locked it. Keep your families safe and lock all doors and be sure they are. Just want the community to know.

Authorities have texted more than 5000 potential victims in Australia to warn they may have been targeted by romance scammers.

The potential victims were identified following an investigation by Philippines authorities into a scam compound operating in central Manila, where more than 300 computer towers, 1000 mobile phones, and thousands of SIM cards were located.

The AFP-led Joint Policing Cybercrime Collaboration Centre (JPC3) identified more than 5000 Australian-based phone numbers linked to messages found on an end-to-end encryption platform on the devices.

The National Anti-Scam Centre, in partnership with JPC3, urges possible victims, some who may not be aware they've been targeted, to not send money to people they've met online and outlined next steps to take if they already have.

STATEMENT FROM THE NSW PREMIER

I have been briefed by NSW Police on an ongoing investigation into a caravan containing explosives dumped in Dural.

It's believed that these explosives were part of an attempted antisemitic attack.

And I want to make it incredibly clear that anyone attempting this level of violence will be met with the full force of a massive and growing police response.

The advice from NSW Police is that this threat has been contained.

The public can be assured that the NSW Police will not stop until these people are defeated and put behind bars.

The vast majority of NSW finds this hateful behaviour abhorrent and appalling.

All of our resources will go towards keeping the community safe and putting an end to division in NSW.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Frequently Asked Questions #29: 'IS IT A LEGAL REQUIREMENT TO HAVE A VISIBLE HOUSE NUMBER ON THE KERB?

NO. There is no legal requirement for kerb numbers. It is optional. It is only a legal

requirement to display the correct house number (street number) on the building (house) OR

fence fronting the street [- see FAQ #28 IS IT A LEGAL REQUIREMENT TO HAVE A VISIBLE

HOUSE NUMBER ON MY HOUSE?].

However, it is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED by Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Kuring-gai &

Hornsby.

 The kerb is chosen to enable emergency services to look to a common place, away from

the physical structure of the house, to identify an address.

- The kerb number should be located about 60cm from your driveway entrance.
- You will need the kerb number to be visible, eg a white number on a black background.

Some councils dictate the height, font, colour and method of kerb numbering. Each Local


Government Area has its own Policy. Please check your council's regulations.

- Rather than simply one number, Neighbourhood Watch suggests all three numbers:
- 1. A number displayed on the façade or fence of the property, and
- 2. In addition, a number displayed on the letterbox (optional) and
- 3. In addition, a number on the kerb outside your property (optional).
- If your home is situated on a corner, the number should face the street named in your

address.

- Reflective numbers are optional, although highly recommended by NHW.
- Double-check for Homeowner's Association restrictions. For the complete FAQ, with reasoning etc, see the FAQ#29 <u>here</u>.
