Gel Blasters are considered actual firearms in NSW. Section 82 of the NSW Firearms Act 1996 states that if a parent (or guardian) knowingly allows a person under the age of 18 years to contravene the Act, each parent/guardian is taken to have contravened the same provision.

Understanding E-Bike Rules in NSW

- All riders and passengers **MUST** wear approved helmets, securely fitted and fastened.
- The electric motor must cut off when the bicycle reaches 25km/h.

Penalties:

- Fines from \$818 for illegal e-bike use.
- Fines for not wearing an approved helmet from \$410
- Riding under the influence of drugs or alcohol can lead to fines or imprisonment.
- On the spot fines for holding a mobile phone from \$410
- Penalties apply for negligent or dangerous riding.

Neighbourhood Watch MEETING REPORT

AGM held Thursday 21 November 2024 @ Gordon Baptist Church

26 attended. Two proposals were passed: 1. to wind down local groups and concentrate volunteer effort on NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby; 2. to close the bank account and transfer the balance to NHW Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby. Also agreed was a contribution of \$150 to Gordon Baptist Church for the use of their Hall in 2023 and 2024.

In future the group will be concentrating its efforts for the benefit of the larger area of Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby. This way more residents will be reached and assisted. The internet has become accessible to most residents, and up-to-date warnings and information are easily accessible, utilising social media, our website and weekly eNewsletters.

Guest speakers:

- **Captain Andrew Wilson**, Killara Rural Fire Brigade: Introduced the new fire station on Koola Avenue.
- **Phil Smith**, Shore Safe Locksmiths: Spoke about securing your storage cage, home, garage, or shed, and how to avoid the current locksmith scams.
- **Sgt Stephen Whalley**, Crime Coordinator, Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command: Gave an update on crime in the command and offered advice.

Advice from Phil & Steve:

Remove car & car keys from view. Always lock car, even on driveway & in garage. Lock any windows in the open position. Install CCTV. Trim greenery below head height. Install sensor lighting. Cover contents of storage cages. Avoid cryptocurrencies. Report everything ASAP. Keep numbers handy (see over for cut-off section to keep.)

Borrow equipment

- Paint house number on kerb
- Paint white lines marking driveway
- Engrave valuable property
- Mark sensitive valuables with UV pen
- Shred documents with personal info

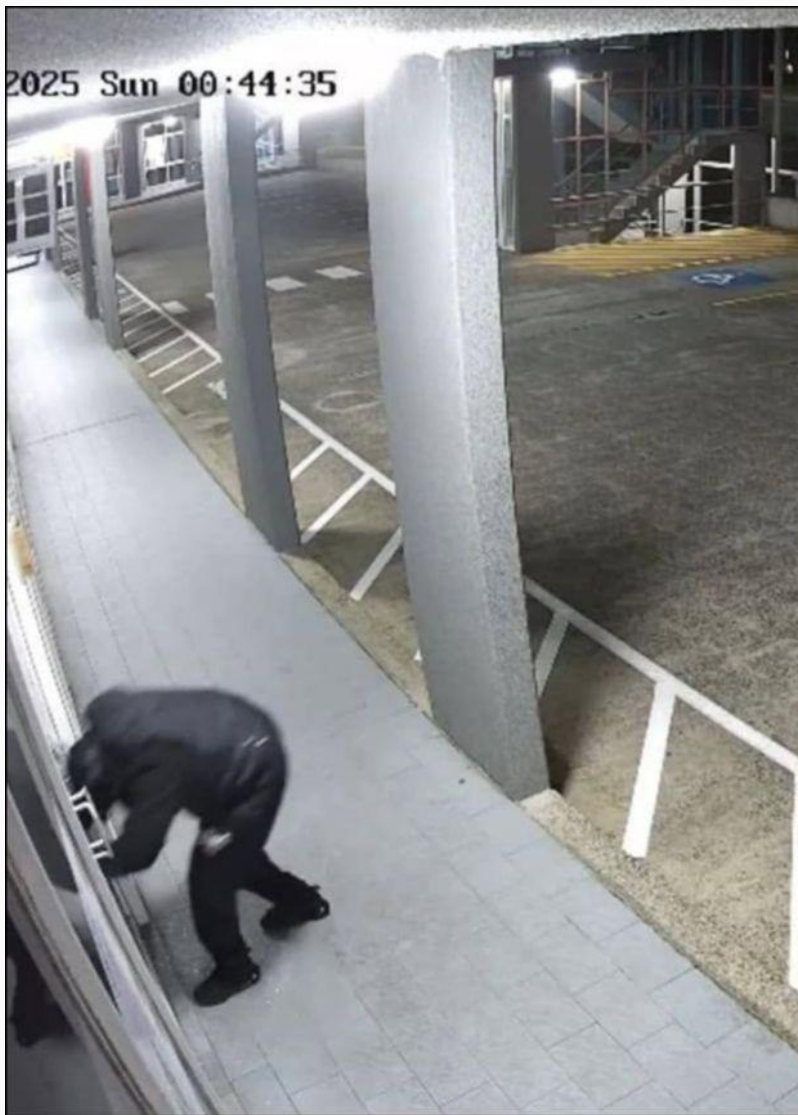
We would to inform all the neighbours that on the night of 6th July at 12.40AM.

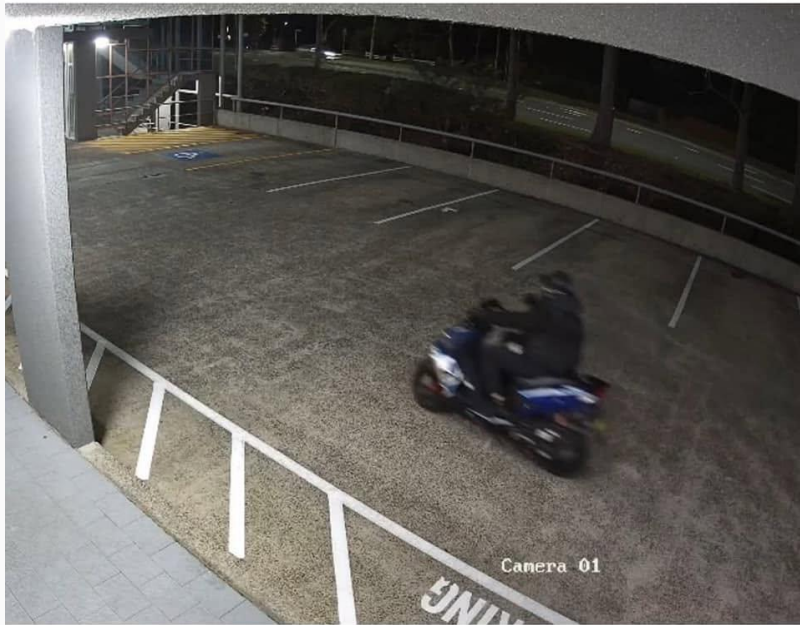
A suspicious individual was seen walking into a couple restaurant and smash the glass into the restaurant. He came with his Motorbike.
